



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Christmas and New Year's are still close enough for us to remember the parties, visiting, and exchanging of cards and gifts. Even if it does not happen everywhere, we may also have had the experience of people letting down the barriers of distinction when the boss, supervisors, and the workers celebrated together as friends and companions.

This is one way in which the new life which Jesus came to give us actually happens. Perhaps it is a sign that the love and unity which Jesus teaches us have not yet been fully accepted. We have distinctions between bosses and subordinates, orders and responsibilities, privileges and obligations, and the lack of trust and full sharing during the rest of the year; and that such divisions are considered necessary in order for the jobs to be done properly.

Today Saint Paul expresses concern about a similar problem and suggests some remedies which might enable the Christians of Corinth, and ourselves today, to move further into the more united and loving relationships that should be clearly noticeable characteristics of a Christian community. (1Cor. 1:10-13)



It seems that some of the new Corinthian Christians had formed their "fan clubs". Some felt that they had found the best because they had been drawn into the Church by Apollos or Peter or some other apostle or missionary. Paul's answer was: "Let there be no factions...Has Christ been divided into parts? Was it Paul who was crucified for you?"

Divisions, factions and hostilities are not a thing of the past, nor are they unique to matters of religion. So often we hear about people who resolutely refuse to see but one side of any issue. For example, some feel that labor and management must be an adversarial relationship, each seeking to "get on top" at any cost, without regard for the rights of the other side. All right is presumed to be on one side. Each side seeks victory and conquest, leaving no room for reasonable dialogue and compromise.

How often do grades and academic status provide the basis for forming cliques and caste systems in schools, as though the value of the individual were measured by grade average? At home, how often do discussions between spouses or between parents and children degenerate into debates in which someone has to win while everyone else loses? Even within the Church, some reject everything that is new or unfamiliar to them, while others reject everything traditional.

Yes, divisions and factions are still very much a part of our lives and our world. Saint Paul's call in the name of Christ to agree and to relate to one another in unity and love is still urgently pertinent. Our problems and disagreements in life will not go away. In every phase of human life, there will still be many difficult questions and inevitable conflicts. But the style with which we choose to deal with them is all-important.

If we are living fully in the spirit of Christ, we do not wish to put others down, but to be at peace and share. We do not write others off as adversaries but seek to understand one another and to find reconciliation. We do not seek to win arguments but to find truth and wisdom by sharing our thoughts in humility and in a spirit of mutual help. Christ is not divided into parts, and neither are we. We are one as human beings. We are one in the one Christ.

PLEASE READ: This may be the last bus trip to the March for Life from Corpus Christi unless someone comes forward to lead next year! Ellie Hentschel and I (Louise Mercurio) have run this trip for many years and we are now stepping down. If you are interested, please call Louise Mercurio at 610-584-4008.

The 44th Annual March for Life will be held on **Friday, January 27, 2017** in Washington, DC. NEW schedule for the day is as follows: *Come prepared for the day and attend 6:30 am Mass at Corpus Christi Parish*, then board the bus at the RE side of Church and we will **leave the CC parking lot at 7:15AM promptly**.

One restroom stop on I95. Continue on to Washington where bus driver will drop us off as close to the beginning of the March as possible (near 7th and Constitution Ave.). March begins about 1PM and we will join in and walk up Constitution (about 1 mile) toward the Capital and continue on to the Supreme Court where we pray for the end of legalized abortion (Roe vs. Wade). We then regroup at the corner and when we have all our people together, we walk to Union Station, where our bus will pick us up (4PM). We leave Washington, and stop on I95 at the Maryland House, which has been newly renovated, has plenty of seating room, and everyone will purchase their dinner from the various food places. (Old Country Buffet has closed.) We will not go to the Shrine and we will not take the Metro train. Everyone should bring a bag lunch and a drink. Bus returns to Corpus Christi by 9 PM. All deposits are transferrable, but not refundable. Bring your gold scarf from previous year. New signups will get a scarf.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

“I beg you brothers in the name of Lord Jesus Christ, to agree on what you say. Let there be no factions; rather be united in mind and judgment...”

Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach the gospel – not with wordy ‘wisdom’ however, lest the cross of Christ be rendered void of its meaning.”

From the early days of the church questions and disputes arose, as the communities were formed and began to grow. Two thousand years later, people continue to line up, choose a banner or are pasted with a label. The words of St. Paul should cause us to pause and think.

I hear many sermons, read many tracts, watch a variety of religious programs. All seem to have different perspectives. If they are credible, they should lead us to the cross of Jesus Christ. If they fail to do this, they are of little worth.

Did we not hear the scripture words “there is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God who is Father?” May we learn to listen with a special ear, discern with a keen eye and discover the wisdom of Jesus Christ and the cross. Next time, don’t listen for just what you want to hear, but what you need to hear.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, **parents are requested to pre-register for the session by contacting the Parish Center Office 215-855-1311.**

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the **RE Room (in the church), at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. February 20th, March 20th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion --- and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.** Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

****CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months*

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.**

REGISTRATION: Our diocese requires that all Catholics should be registered in the parish of their residence. If you have moved into our parish and have not registered with us, it is important that you call the Parish Center Office (215-855-1311) and make arrangements to do so as soon as possible. Certificates of Eligibility to act as a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, **cannot be issued** unless you are already (preferably for 6 months) registered with us. **Please be aware that young adults over 21 (25 if in college) should register separately.**
