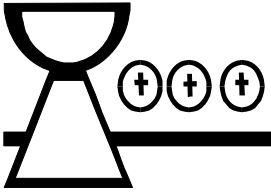

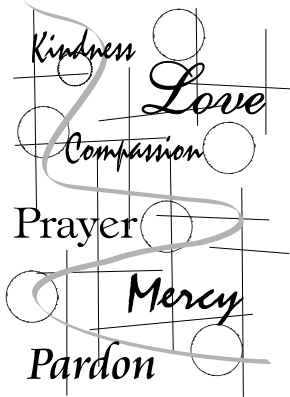

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Are you rich, well-fed, and complacent? If you are, then you had better consider carefully what Jesus told the people who listened to His sermon today. The introductory words of that sermon in today's gospel should make all of us sit up and pay close attention. If we are so self-satisfied that we neglect to follow our Lord's teachings in the rest of that discourse we may be in for big trouble.

In speaking to this crowd, Jesus outlined the kind of conduct He expected from His followers. He tells us to love our enemies, be merciful, forgiving, not judgmental, and to do unto others as we would have them do to us. These precepts are practical implications of His two basic commandments: love of God and love of others. However, such love requires detachment from both worldly concerns and selfish pleasures.



Christ's incarnation was God's self-revelation to the world. By the birth of Jesus, the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity became a man whom people could experience directly through human faculties of sense and understanding. They could listen to His teachings and observe His actions as He disclosed through word and action God's loving plan for our salvation. He invited all who were willing to believe in Him, and willing to adopt the way of life He preached, to join in His community of divine love.

This community, which Jesus often referred to as "the kingdom of heaven" or "the reign of God" would include all those whom the Father had called to share in eternal life. Establishing this new order would entail a better fight against the evil which pervaded the world. As the Messiah sent by God the Father to lead this struggle, Jesus would have to sacrifice His life in the supreme act of love.

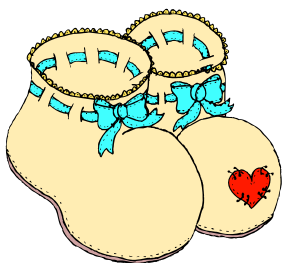
The good news Jesus preached was the coming of the kingdom. Entrance into that realm, however, required a moral revolution, a total change in one's way of life. In order to be eligible for membership, one would have to give up old values which prized riches, power, and worldly pleasure, and replace them with new standards based on love and self-sacrifice.

In terms of spiritual advantage, those who are poor, hungry, and distressed are truly blessed. They have little to lose in devoting themselves to love of God and their neighbor. It is much more difficult for people rich with material goods, who have plenty to eat and are captured by earthly amusements, to accept Christ's message. They must turn their backs on many comforts they enjoy.

From a purely human point of view it would be impossible for most of us to meet the standard Jesus established for entering the kingdom of God. He asks us to become like Him, consumed by the spirit of unconditional love, emptying ourselves of selfish desires and ambitions. Weak and sinful as we are, this ideal seems far out of reach. However, by His death and resurrection Christ earned for us the possibility. Through Baptism and the Holy Eucharist we become members of His own body and His love lives in us through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

If we believe in the risen Christ and commit ourselves to obey His commandments of love, He has promised us the help we need to realize the possibility of living the Christian life. It is up to each of us to choose, but to those who make this commitment He has promised the astonishing reward of an eternal life of happiness.

First Reading: Sirach 15:15-20 This passage from Sirach gives strong, unequivocal emphasis to free will in every person. Before each of us is set sin or virtue, life or death, and each of us are free to choose the one or the other.

Responsorial PS 119:1-2, 4-5, 17-18, 33-34
R. (1b) Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord!

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10 Paul explains to the Corinthians that there are two different kinds of wisdom — the wisdom of God and the wisdom of the world. The wisdom of God is mysterious, but this wisdom has been revealed “to those who love Him” through the Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells the people He has come to fulfill the law. He speaks strongly against murder and anger, against adultery and lust, and against false oaths and lies. He warns the people that unless their virtue exceeds that of the Pharisees, they “will not enter the kingdom of God.”

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

“What we utter is God’s wisdom: a mysterious hidden wisdom. God planned it before all ages for our glory. Yet God has revealed this wisdom to us through the Spirit... Jesus said to His disciples: ‘I tell you unless your holiness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees you shall not enter the kingdom of God.’”

The ‘professional’ religious people of Jesus’ time knew the bible, practiced in detail the requirements of their faith, and most were holy people. They knew the word, lived the word and incorporated it into the daily living.

Fast forward: How does the wisdom of God play out in my life? I know many things from the bible. I can speak about the four gospel writers and enjoy the life of the primitive church as I find it in the Acts of the Apostles. Some passages especially from the letters of Saint Paul, as the hymn of charity or the fruits of the Holy Spirit in Corinthians and Galatians move me.

The wisdom found in the scriptures is to direct my life and focus on just one thing, that is my holiness. Knowledge in the head must move down a few inches and become the life giving pump for my heart. Holiness too is a gift of God for me to seek, discover and accept. We call Jesus ‘the holy One of God’ and we are to be as well.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office 215-855-1311*. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled **at 7:00 PM RE Room (in the church) on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e February 20th, March 20th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - received First Holy Communion - and *actively* practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* **MUST** be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date. Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

****CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.*

Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.

Confessions: Saturday after 7:15AM Mass 3:15PM - 4:00PM, and also upon request at the Parish House.

REGISTRATION: Our diocese requires that all Catholics should be registered in the parish of their residence. If you have moved into our parish and have not registered with us, it is important that you call the Parish Center Office (215-855-1311) and make arrangements to do so as soon as possible. Certificates of Eligibility to act as a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, **cannot be issued** unless you are already (preferably for 6 months) registered with us. **Please be aware that young adults over 21 (25 if in college) should register separately.**
