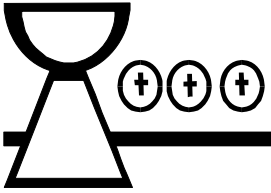

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Remember last Summer? For most of us, we enjoyed the warmth of the Summer sun. Some days were picture perfect – other days had rain or were just plain hot! Many of us probably spent at least some time watering lawns and flowers. Without water, nothing grows – nothing remains green. Perhaps in our Summer chores, we also found ourselves dry and parched. Recall how a cold drink of water or perhaps a swim in a lake or a pool was just what we needed to cool off from the heat of the Summer.

In today's reading from the Book of Exodus, we recall the Jewish people's exile out of Egypt. As they made their way through the Sinai peninsula, they were exposed to the extreme heat of the sun – to the dry parched land of the desert. They easily became exhausted, walking for miles and miles at a time in the desert climate. As their thirst grew, their faith in God's plan for them diminished. Their unfortunate lack of trust in God's providence bred quarreling, dissension and their constant displeasure. They grumbled against Moses. They doubted God's plan. Yet, in God's goodness, water was given to the Israelites from the rock that Moses struck. As they quenched their thirst, the quarreling ceased and they returned to their faith in God, and in God's plan for them.

The passage from Paul's letter to the Romans acknowledges that because of our sinfulness and selfishness, our faith is not always the best that it can be. But, Jesus – given to all by the Father as a free gift of His unconditional love – reminds us that He died for our sins while we were still sinful. It is only through the death of Jesus that the bond of sin was crushed, and that we are redeemed once and for all. Just as God shows His unconditional love for us, it is important that we strive to emulate that love in all of our daily interactions with others.



In today's Gospel, we hear how the words of Jesus inspire people to come to the faith. This beautiful story of the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well shows Jesus' love, compassion, and forgiveness. She was so moved by her interaction with Jesus that she proclaimed the story to many of the townspeople. Through her retelling of that story, the people believed in Jesus. Those who were able to see Jesus with their own eyes and hear His truth with their own ears, were also moved to greater faith and trust in Jesus. Jesus' promise of giving "living water" was being fulfilled in the midst of what happened to that Samaritan town.

All of our readings today help us to recognize that we, too, sometimes lose faith in God and in God's plan for us. As we lose faith, we often become selfish and sinning becomes easier and more frequent. Yet we are reminded that Jesus can and does forgive our sins. He helps us to find a way out of our sinfulness and back to God. Through the gift of Scripture and the grace of the Sacraments, we are nourished and nurtured through Jesus' promise of living water. In this way we share in the life of grace and the promise of eternal life.

As we thirst for the water to quench our dryness, may we find ourselves thirsty for Christ. Then we may truly learn to follow more faithfully His words and example. May we also hunger and thirst for the things of heaven, even while struggling here on earth to live good, moral, and faith-filled lives.

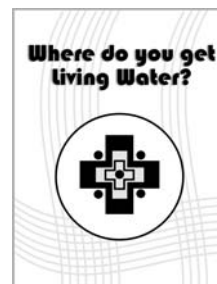

First Reading: Exodus 17:3-7 This story from Exodus reveals that the Israelites, after their escape from Egypt, cast all blame for their sufferings on Moses. In this instance, they were dying of thirst. When Moses appealed to the Lord, the Lord directed Moses to strike a rock and water would gush forth.

Responsorial : PS 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9

R. (8) If today you hear His voice, harden not your hearts.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 Paul reminds the Romans that because Christ died for all people, they are acceptable in God's sight.



Gospel: John 4:5-42 Jesus converses with the Samaritan woman at Jacob's Well. When Jesus indicates that whoever drinks from the water He gives will never be thirsty again, the woman immediately answers, "Give me this water, sir...". Jesus then reveals that she has had five husbands and tells her that He is the Messiah. The woman believes Jesus and proclaims this news to all the townspeople, who believe her and come to see Jesus.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

"How can you ask me, a Samaritan and a woman, for a drink? Jesus replied: 'If only you recognized God's gift, and Who it is that is asking you for a drink, you would have asked Him instead, and He would have given you living water.'... Now that we have been justified by faith we are at peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."

Remember the raging waters which roared through Houston and Baton Rouge last summer? Remember the arid conditions of the droughts in California and New Jersey at the same time? Too much water, or no water at all. Water gives life, sustains life. Without it, we die.

Jesus, as He conversed with the Samaritan woman brought her to new insights making her wonder if He might be the messiah. She opened her eyes and heart, acknowledging that He knew her need. How few of us would invite others to come and meet someone who told me everything I ever did." Could this be the Messiah?"

The lady took steps – a man, a Jew, a rabbi, a messiah, as she grew to accept Jesus. Cancer unfortunately is classified as being at certain stages. The spiritual life, like the Samaritan woman, happily finds us moving forward. As I begin this third week of Lent, I ask myself 'at what stage am I?' How ready am I to move forward. Are my eyes and heart open?

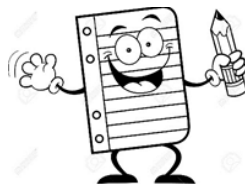

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, **parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.**

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. March 20th, April 17th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered, practicing member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.**

Certificates of eligibility* must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

****CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months

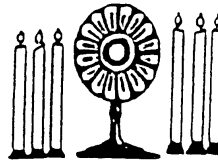
Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.**
