



PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Parishioners,

The Easter season is a time of new life in the Church, a time to rejoice, a time to look at new beginnings. But mixed within the joy of new birth comes the ordinary, and sometimes heavy burdens of our lives. If we limit our thoughts only to the positive aspects of new life, we will be disillusioned. If we view life only through the lens of all that burdens us, we will lose hope. It is better for us to view life through the experience of the risen Lord. Our own resurrection will come about because of His suffering and death. Jesus wove the experience of suffering and death into the promise of new life. He was successful at giving new meaning to the burdens that we carry through the promise of new life.

When we hear today's gospel, we recognize that the disciples had many fears and doubts, not only Thomas the doubter, but all of the disciples. Does this insight surprise you? Can you even imagine that the disciples were unable to see that the Lord had risen until He came and stood before them? Peter and another of Jesus' disciples had gone to the tomb early in the morning at the bequest of Mary Magdalene, who was the first to view the empty tomb. There, they also encountered the empty tomb. After leaving the tomb, they again heard from Mary Magdalene that the risen Lord had appeared to her.

Why are we hearing about the weaknesses of the disciples? Of what importance is this to the resurrection, the giving of the Holy Spirit, and the mission of the Church? People who are not sick do not need a doctor. People who believe that they are all powerful, think they do not need a redeeming God. Only in acknowledging our weakness and need can we be receptive of God's plan of redemption. If we have no fears or doubts, we have no need for peace and faith. The disciples were ordinary people, and the gospel writer illustrates their weaknesses for our benefit, so that we will recognize ourselves in them.


**Peace be
to you**



Behind locked doors the disciples encountered the risen Lord. "Peace be with you," were the first words spoken by Jesus to calm their fears. His gift to them was to breathe the Holy Spirit upon them giving them new spiritual life. They were sent into the world to tell others about the saving power of Jesus. They were to heal others by the forgiveness of sins. Through their encounter with the risen Lord the disciples no longer doubted, but came to believe. The Resurrection was not born of their faith, rather their faith was born out of their meeting the risen Lord. Filled with the Holy Spirit they were now able to see the Lord through the eyes of faith.

If the Resurrection of Jesus had depended upon the faith of the disciples, then it would not have occurred. Nor does the reality of the risen Lord depend on our faith. We know our faults and weaknesses and they are not unlike those of the disciples. This is cause for great hope. The disciples came to believe, were given the Holy Spirit, and were sent out to spread the good news because they had met the risen Christ. We, too, can meet the risen Lord each day of our lives. We have heard the good news, we have come to believe, to receive the Holy Spirit, and be part of the mission of the Church. This is the new life in the risen Lord which is God's gift of redemption spoken of in today's gospel. Come to the tomb and see for yourself. Do not persist in your unbelief, but believe. He has risen. Alleluia!

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY AT CORPUS CHRISTI

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. Surely the gospel passage reassures us that the presence of the Risen Christ is to allow His mercy to touch our lives. As He says 'Peace be with you' consider that He is asking you if you want to know His mercy and forgiveness. Because His mercy is without limit, what things or what one thing, do I feel I need to ask for forgiveness? Unfortunately, because we have lost a sense of sin, we have also presumed the gift of mercy which Jesus offers us, but wishes us to seek.

May I use the Divine Mercy Sunday to do three things:

1. Know the Lord wishes to forgive me.
 2. Know that I am in need of forgiveness for something.
 3. Ask for forgiveness of others and celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation. Don't let God's mercy go to waste!
- Through the ministry of the church may He give you pardon and peace.'

Corpus Christi Parish will celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday April 7, 2013 from 3-4PM. We will have the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, our homilist will be Msgr. Flanigan and confessors will be available. The Divine Mercy chaplet will be sung. Please come and pray together for the mercy of God to extend to all those most in need of His healing mercy.



First Reading: Acts 5:12-16 The people held the apostles in great esteem and brought sick people to them to be healed. Although some were afraid to be known, the number of Jesus' followers continued to grow steadily.

Responsorial Psalm: 118:2-4,13-15,22-24 A song of praise to the Lord.

Second Reading: Revelation 1:9-11a, 12-13, 17-19 John depicts a vision of lamp-stands of gold and one like the Son of Man in a robe with a sash of gold. This apparition told John he had nothing to fear and then described Himself as one who was dead but now lived again. He then instructed John to record any other visions he might have.

Gospel: John 20:19-31 Jesus appeared to the disciples and breathed on them saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit." He gives them the power to forgive people's sins or hold them accountable. Thomas, who was not present, refused to believe Jesus had appeared until He came to them once more. Jesus told Thomas to believe and added, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."



Family Connection

Our family life would no doubt be enhanced if we were able to transform Jesus' greeting into a central feature in our family's interactions. After His Resurrection, "Peace be with you" is the first thing that Jesus says to His disciples. This could be our daily family prayer for one another. In today's Gospel, we also hear that Jesus next breathed on His disciples and gave them the gift of the Holy Spirit. In Baptism, each of us has received the gift of the Holy Spirit as well as the forgiveness of sins. Peace is a fruit of the Holy Spirit. Our Baptism, then, invites us to share in the peace that Christ gave to His disciples and commissions us to share that peace of Christ by generously forgiving others as Jesus taught.

As you gather as a family, think about gifts that you might receive together such as a coloring book and crayons, a book and bookmark, or an electronic item and batteries. Observe that Jesus also paired two gifts together in today's Gospel. Read aloud this Sunday's Gospel, John 20:19-31. Discuss the two gifts Jesus gave to His disciples: peace and the Holy Spirit. Ask: What were the disciples to do with these gifts? (They were sent as Jesus was sent by the Father to forgive sins.) Recall that we have each received Jesus' gift of the Holy Spirit at our Baptism and that peace is a fruit of the Holy Spirit. Observe that since we also have received these gifts from Christ, we are also sent to be people who forgive others as Jesus taught. Determine an action that your family can do to share peace and forgiveness with one another. Pray together the Prayer to the Holy Spirit or the Peace Prayer of St. Francis.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, **parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office 215-855-1311.** Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled at **7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month in the RE Room (in the church) i.e. April 15th, May 20th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - received First Holy Communion - and *actively* practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* **MUST** be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date. Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

***CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. This person must be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.

Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.

Confessions: Saturday after 7:15AM Mass 3:15PM – 4:00PM, and also upon request at the Parish House

PRAYER GROUP: to which ALL are invited meets on Thursday evenings in the Church Chapel at 8PM.
