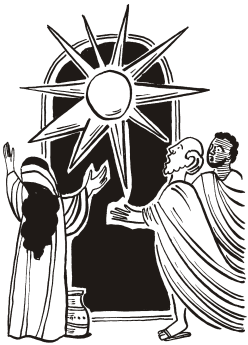
PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Parishioners,

Suppose you visited a family grave site and found a gaping hole there with the headstone gone. You would immediately conclude that the cemetery workers had moved the remains somewhere else and the stone had to be corrected. You would never have thought that the body buried there had risen. This is what Mary Magdalene, Peter, and John thought when they arrived at the tomb of Jesus on Easter Sunday morning. Dead bodies do not get up and walk away.

Our faith began in a cemetery, not in a stable, not at the River Jordan, or in the Upper Room. The first resurrection appearances happened in a cemetery garden. Maybe that is why many cemeteries look like beautiful parks and are such quiet and peaceful places to visit. For believers, cemeteries are places of memories and reminders of resurrected life. People love to visit their loved one's graves, to sit on the grass, say some prayers, and remember the happy times and faces. We do not need anyone to tell us that our loved ones are not there. We know that. We believe that they are risen. That is what Easter tells us: **Jesus is risen and some day so will we.**



Cemeteries are holy ground – Easter places – and Easter tells us that the tomb of Jesus is empty. He is not there. He has gone ahead of us. Easter tells us that the graves of our dearly departed are also empty. Our loved ones are alive and are with God and we will see them again. Finally, Easter tells us that our graves will also be empty. When death comes, it will be only for an instant. We will continue to live with our Risen Lord with our loved ones and with all the saints of the ages. Easter tells that we were born to live forever. The stone is rolled away.

At the same time, there is precious little humor to be found in cemeteries. Too much pain and sadness rest beneath the sod. Laying the body of a loved one to rest is an occasion for tears, not laughter. Only an empty tomb can evoke laughter – an abandoned tomb where a few stains and wrinkled cloths are all that remain to show that death once reigned in that place. Only those who peer into that empty tomb and find no corpse can smile and laugh. The abandoned tomb into which we peer today is not only the Lord's but our own as well. By the power of the Resurrection, we, too, will be raised to new and everlasting life.

Because the grave of Jesus is empty, our graves will be empty. The power of sin and death has been broken and it is up to us now to laugh, dance, sing, smile, rejoice and go forward to carry this good news to all our brothers and sisters. Jesus is alive and we will see Him. Our loved ones are alive and we will see them again. Because of His Resurrection, we, too, will live forever. Happy Easter!

First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43 In this passage, Peter testifies that he and his followers saw the miracles performed by Christ, witnessed His death, and believe in His resurrection. Now they will proclaim to all that Christ is the Son of God.

Responsorial : PS 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23

R. (24) This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4 Paul tells the Colossians that they will appear with Christ in glory. They should be mindful of things above rather than things on earth.

Gospel: John 20:1-9 In vivid detail, John tells us that when Mary Magdalene visited Christ's tomb, the tomb was empty. She told the apostles, who ran to the tomb, and saw the "wrappings" on the ground. The disciple who entered first "saw and believed."

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly



"This man God raised on the third day and granted that He be visible, not to all the people but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance, who ate and drank with Him after He rose from the dead. He commissioned us to preach to the people, and testify that He is the one appointed by God to judge the living and the dead. To Him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in Him will receive forgiveness of sins though His name."

The resurrection accounts of Jesus' appearances, following the empty tomb scene, are familiar and the source of hope and joy. The words of Peter in the sermon from the Acts of the Apostles, brings the meaning of His resurrection to us in 2017. Jesus' redeeming sacrifice earns forgiveness and new life for us today. Remember, this is the same Peter who shortly before denied knowing the Lord because of fear and intimidation. This sermon of Peter, and others he spoke, as did Paul, summon us to let Easter speak to us today. The Risen Lord offers us the gift of new life, won at Calvary, and generously given if we sincerely turn to Him.

May we let the grace of this day bring the richness of God's grace to us all.

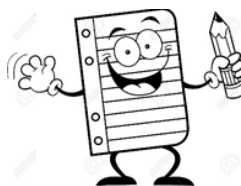

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311*. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e. April 17th, May 15th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.** Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

***CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married, marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.*

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.**
