PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles should lift us up emotionally as well as challenge us. Paul and Barnabas have been traveling in the area north of Israel when they arrive at the city of Antioch. To all willing to listen they explain the wonderful news of the life and resurrection of Jesus. On the Sabbath almost the entire city gathers to hear them speak about the Lord. The Jewish residents of the city, however, are filled with jealousy and violently contradict what Paul has to say. Paul tells them that the word of God came first to the Jews but since they rejected it, ". . . we now turn to the Gentiles. For the Lord commanded us, I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation."

Jumping ahead to today, that "you" in Paul's words is each of us. We have been chosen to manifest the marvelous re-ordering of human thought and understanding expressed in the teachings of Jesus. We need to admit, it is nice to be chosen! Think back to occasions in your lives when you experienced the delight of being chosen. Maybe it was at work when you were offered a surprise promotion. Perhaps there was a time in your life when some award or recognition came your way. And of course many of you have been chosen as spouses in marriage. Certainly we can remember the joy and satisfaction of being chosen.

However, now consider the second part of Paul's message, that is, we are to be a "light to the Gentiles . . and instrument of salvation" for others. Today's Gentiles are all those individuals with whom we come in contact – our families, friends, and co-workers, the members of our parish, and even those who comprise our civic community and nation. We are challenged to shine forth the transforming and healing light of the resurrected Jesus.

Consider for a moment the metaphor we hear in today's Gospel. Jesus uses an example which His listeners would have easily understood. He explains, "My sheep hear My voice, I know them and they follow Me... I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish." Going beyond the words to the intent of Jesus, we, the sheep, are both delighted and challenged. When it comes to this challenge, just how are we doing? Is our discipleship so visible that others recognize us as the sheep of Jesus? Is our commitment so obvious that there is no doubt that we are instruments of salvation to others? We need to be both practical and specific in assessing our responses to these questions.

We need to evaluate our acceptance of the challenge found in today's readings. Yes, we have been chosen to be "instruments of salvation to the ends of the earth." Let us pray for each other that we can increase and deepen our response to the challenge that God has given us.

First Reading: Acts 13:14, 43-52 Paul and Barnabas addressed many people, and large crowds gathered to hear them. Some of the Jews became jealous, and argued with whatever Paul said. But Paul and Barnabas continued preaching their message of salvation and everlasting life, until they were eventually forced to leave the town.

Responsorial Psalm: *145:8-9,10-11,12-13* A song of praise to God.

Second Reading: *Revelation 7:9, 14b-17* John saw a vision of many people surrounding a throne and the Lamb. One of the elders told him these were the people who had survived great periods of trial, but maintained strong faith in God. Now they would receive eternal protection and comfort from God as reward for their loyalty.



Gospel: John 10:27-30 Jesus states that His sheep know His voice and follow Him, and will receive eternal life. Jesus also says that no one can snatch His followers away, because God is greater than anyone who might try, and Jesus is one with God.

Family Connection

Not only can we recognize family members' voices, we can also read the tone of their voices and know something about how they are feeling. In our relationship with Jesus, we know Jesus' voice and are called to follow. Jesus doesn't just bring us closer to the Father, Jesus puts us directly into contact with God the Father, removing all distance between us. In the Gospel of John, Jesus identifies so closely with the Father that He tells us that They are One—not just close, but actually one. Knowing Jesus means knowing the Father.

Read with your family today's Gospel, John 10:27-30. Ask your family members to talk about some ways that Jesus brings them closer to God and closer to one another. Pray together the Acts of Faith, Hope, and Love.



BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office 215-855-1311.* Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month in the RE Room (in the church) i.e. May 20th, June 17th. REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- → must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- → must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- → must have been Baptized Confirmed received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- → if married must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- \rightarrow cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- \rightarrow the godparents are to be one male and one female
- → one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent MUST be Catholic
- → a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date. Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY: A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. This person must be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.

Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.
