

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

If it were against the law to be a Christian, how many of us would be convicted? This is an old question preachers often asked their congregations, but it's one we should never tire of asking ourselves. Suppose you were the prosecutor? What evidence would it take to prove that someone is really a follower of Christ? Would it be enough to say that those who regularly attend Church, put money in the collection or send their kids to a Christian school are followers of Christ? What if a person belonged to a Church-related organization or was active in pro-life activities? Would this be enough to be called a Christian?

Some of these things may be pretty good indicators of one who follows Christ, but if we look seriously at what Jesus called the most important criterion, we would not meet it. In today's gospel reading Jesus told His apostles to love one another. Then He told them, "This is how all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another."

Pretty simple, isn't it? A lot depends upon what Jesus meant when He said we should love one another. From reading other parts of the gospel, it becomes clear that He didn't simply mean we should love the people we attend Church with or other Christians in general. That in itself might be difficult, when we consider the wide array of people it encompasses. It includes some we might dislike because of political, economic or social positions or viewpoints. But our Lord made it clear that His disciples must love all human beings, even unbelievers and enemies. Saint Paul was among the first to appreciate the implications of Jesus' "new law" and he became known as the "Apostle to the Gentiles".

Behold, I make all things new.



In our own day Christ's commandment has similar striking implications. Christian Palestinians must love their Jewish neighbors and Christians in Israel must reciprocate. Catholics and Protestants in Northern Ireland, as well as elsewhere, are called by Christ to love one each other. Followers of Christ in the Balkans must love their neighbors regardless of ethnic differences. All Christians are called to love those of all races and cultures, despite any past animosity or grievance.

If all of this seems utopian - an impractical ideal - we must remember, that Jesus came precisely to bring about this ideal. In proclaiming the coming of the kingdom of God, He intended to establish "a new heaven and a new earth". For us this may seem impractical, but for God, who said, "Behold, I make all things new," the prediction of its coming is trustworthy and true.

As Jesus told us, the choice is ours. We can choose to become part of His kingdom if we believe in Him and follow His commandments. If we do so, He promised to send us the Holy Spirit of His divine love which can transform our hearts, and make what seems impossible come true. Then, as we carry out His command to love one another, everyone will know we are His disciples.

First Reading: *Acts 14:21-27* Paul and Barnabas traveled to many towns and found many disciples willing to help them preach. They warned their disciples of the trials they would face. Paul and Barnabas then returned to Antioch, where their journey had begun, and told the congregation there of the progress they had made.

Responsorial Psalm: 145:8-9,10-11,12-13 A song of praise to God.

Second Reading: *Revelation 21:1-5a* John had a vision of a new earth, and a new Jerusalem coming down from heaven. Then a voice described Jerusalem as a place where God would live among His people and comfort them. The former world had vanished, and pain, death and suffering had left the world as well.

Gospel: John 13:31-33a, 34-35 After Judas left the last supper, Jesus warned the other disciples that He would not be with them much longer. Jesus gave them a new commandment to love one another as He had loved them. He stated that their love for each other would distinguish them as His disciples.



Family Connection

Is love the first word your family members use to describe their interactions? Love is difficult. Jesus' sacrifice for us is an example of this. Yet because of love, the glory of God is fully revealed in Jesus. God's glory is revealed in us when we act as the Body of Christ, as individuals and as a community. In the love we have for one another—difficult, challenging, sacrificial love—we find Jesus. Choose one or two occasions when your

family was together during the week. Describe the family's interactions from an outsider's perspective. When is it less difficult to show love to family members? When is it more difficult? When love is difficult, what do we do?

Jesus didn't just tell us to love one another. He showed us how to love one another. In what ways did Jesus show us how to love? (in His acts of healing and forgiving; at the Last Supper as He washed His disciples' feet; in the gift of the Eucharist; through His death on the Cross)

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are* required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e. May 20th, June 17th.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class

must have completed his/her 16th birthday must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance

if married - must be living in a valid sacramental

cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized

the godparents are to be one male and one female one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent MUST be Catholic

a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date. Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY: A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. This person must be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.

Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.
