

# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

We may be tempted to imagine that life for the first followers of Jesus was ideal. We may even imagine that they were so close to the Lord that they were immune from all kinds of concerns and divisions – those things which typically affect our lives and the Church community today. However, we know that they did not have it all together, anymore than we do! In today's readings we hear words like dissension, distress and fear which give us a more realistic picture of the early Church. It is not that we want to dwell on the negative in pointing this out. Rather, we need to ask that if this was normal for the first disciples, then what does their experience mean for us today?



Many problems face the Church today: world problems of hunger, poverty, and war, to name a few; and internal problems, such as a shortage of priests, the clergy scandal, and disagreements among theologians. There are always factions within the Church that cause division. Where do we turn for help in times like this? Where did our ancestors turn for help? In Catholic tradition we normally turn to God in Scripture, the sacraments, and the life of the Church. Hope is offered through the experience of the risen Lord present by the power of the Holy Spirit in the Church. Scripture gives us the examples of how disagreements among the disciples were resolved. Scripture also tells us of the promise of the Holy Spirit Who will instruct us and remind us of all that Jesus taught.

At the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles the Holy Spirit is given to the Apostles at Pentecost. Filled with the Spirit they were sent to witness in Jerusalem and to the ends of the earth. Their mission was not without its pitfalls. At times they were rejected and misunderstood. They faced threats, abuse, and violence for the sake of the gospel. This was to be expected. The unexpected, however, was the disagreement and confusion among the followers of Christ brought about by some of the teachers.

Being filled with the Spirit did not take away their humanness. They were still vulnerable just like us. More important than their disagreement in today's account is what Paul and Barnabas chose to do about the problem. They agreed to meet with the apostles and elders in Jerusalem where they sought the guidance of the Holy Spirit. They agreed that no undue burden was to be placed on the people, and the requirement of circumcision was lifted.

The Holy Spirit is very much alive and active in the Church today. We are challenged to imitate the apostles in their efforts to build bridges and to be of one mind and heart in all things. We must ask ourselves what division exists in our lives that we can ask the Holy Spirit to help us resolve. What problems do we fear in the Church that require a greater power to bring them to resolution? Where in this world do God's people cry out for justice?

The mission of the Church continues today just as it began in that first community of believers. Much has changed since then, but the love of God is still our anthem to which the Holy Spirit gives voice for all to hear. This love, present in the Holy Spirit, is the fruit of God's grace which will help us to overcome division and be of one heart and mind as well as one body in Christ – the risen Lord.

**First Reading:** *Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2,22-29* Some men informed the Gentiles that they must be circumcised if they wished to be saved, because of the Old Laws. Disciples then went forth to tell the Gentiles to honor only those rules which were strictly necessary, such as abstaining from eating meat sacrificed to idols and illicit sexual union.

**Responsorial Psalm:** 67:2-3,5,6,8 A prayer that all the nations sing praise to God



Second Reading: Revelation 21:10-14,22-23 John depicts Jerusalem coming out of heaven, sparkling with the radiance of precious jewels. Angels were stationed at each of its twelve gates, and each gate bore the name of one tribe of Israel. The city had no temple, because God was its temple. The glory and light of God and the Lamb also replaced their need for the sun.

Gospel: John 14:23-29 Jesus tells His disciples, "Anyone who loves Me will be true to My word." For those who do honor His word, both Jesus and God will love them and stay with them always. He also tells them that God will send the Holy Spirit in His place to give them the instructions they will need. Jesus then tells them that peace is His farewell gift to them.

#### **Family Connection**

Parents are always helping their children prepare for something, whether that consists of getting ready for school, preparing for an exam, or making preparations to go on vacation. In today's Gospel, Jesus prepares His disciples for His Passion, death, and Resurrection. He promises His Holy Spirit, gives them the gift of His peace, and tells them not to be troubled.

As a family, talk about the kinds of events that you have prepared for together; surgeries, funerals, vacations, and first days of school are some examples. Talk about why it is important to prepare for important events in our lives. Then read aloud this Sunday's Gospel: John 14:23-29. Talk about how Jesus prepared His disciples for His Death and Resurrection and how He wanted them to be prepared for what would happen so that they would be able to believe.

Talk about how, as a family, you can prepare for Pentecost (only 2 weeks away), when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, our Advocate.

**BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS:** Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office*, 215-855-1311.

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. May 20th, June 17th.

#### REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered, practicing member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- → must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- → must have been Baptized Confirmed and has received First Holy Communion and actively practicing their faith e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- → if married must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- → cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- → the godparents are to be one male and one female
- → one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent MUST be Catholic
- → a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility\* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.

Certificates of eligibility\* must have a parish seal and cannot be

faxed; they must be the original.

\*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY: A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. This person must be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.

Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.
