PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners.

The account of the risen Lord's encounter with His disciples, as recorded in today's gospel, is intriguing in several respects. It is only one of several appearances of the newly risen Lord to His fearful, and somewhat bewildered, followers. Here we are given a glimpse of the fears the first leaders of the Church faced. They were fragile and frightened; in reality they were hiding out, and with good reason. The disciples had recently witnessed the brutal and humiliating execution of their Master. And now, here He was wishing them peace.



In what must be one of the greatest understatements in the Bible, the disciples, upon being shown the wounds of Christ, said they were glad to see Him – they rejoiced. They were glad, yes, but they were also thrilled, shocked, and mystified. Even more than this, they were transformed. They are now confident emissaries of love and reconciliation.

Beyond convincing His followers of His resurrection, Jesus has a mission in mind for them, a mission to which the Church is still committed today. The disciples and their successors are to bring forgiveness to a world bound to sin. The good news is very good indeed. It is the message that the cruelty of the cross, caused by both our condition of original sin, and our cooperation through personal sin, can be forgiven and healed. In fact, this is the institution of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

To accomplish so overwhelming a task, the apostles will need to have confident boldness, encouraged by their first-hand knowledge of the risen Christ. A boldness reenforced by the same power that enabled Jesus to rise from the dead. They will need, and will be given, the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit who enables, empowers, and brings to fruition what Christ wills for His Church and her apostolate. It is the Holy Spirit who ensures the authenticity of the message that the Church proclaims. The Holy Spirit brings forth from the diversity of the people of God, the different gifts necessary to continue the work begun by Jesus.



First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2: 1-11 The disciples were celebrating Pentecost together when "tongues of fire appeared which parted, then came to rest on each of them." The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in foreign tongues. Visitors from many different countries were amazed that each guest could hear his or her native language being spoken as the disciples proclaimed God's glory.

Responsorial Psalm: *104:1,24,29-31,34* God's Spirit renews the earth.

Second Reading: *1 Corinthians 12:3b-7,12-13* Each person has received different manifestations of the same spirit to contribute to the common good of all. All members of the church have been baptized into one body because of our belief in the Holy Spirit, Who was sent to us by God.



Gospel: John 20:19-23 Jesus appeared to the disciples even though they had locked the doors in fear. Jesus then showed the disciples His hands and His side; and they rejoiced at His presence. He breathed on them saying "Receive the Holy Spirit." He then gave the disciples the power to forgive others or hold them accountable for their sins.

Family Connection

Pentecost is sometimes called the birthday of the Church. The Gospel for Pentecost reminds us that the Church begins with the command to forgive. Within the family, the domestic Church, we learn how to forgive and we learn to accept forgiveness. It is the gift of the Holy Spirit that enables us to do both. Today is a fitting time to share a family celebration of reconciliation.

As you gather together as a family, sit quietly for a few minutes, inviting all to reflect upon their need to forgive and to receive forgiveness. If there is a situation or issue within the family that needs attention, spend some time reflecting upon the concern and how your family might address it. Read together today's Gospel, John 20:19-23. Talk together about how Jesus gave us the gift of the Holy Spirit to help us in the work of forgiveness and to bring us peace. Pray together today's psalm, or the Prayer to the Holy Spirit, asking that the Holy Spirit help your family. Share with one another the sign of peace.



BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office*, 215-855-1311. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e. May 20th, June 17th.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- → must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- \rightarrow must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- → must have been Baptized Confirmed and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- \rightarrow if married must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- \rightarrow cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- \rightarrow the godparents are to be one male and one female
- → one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent MUST be Catholic
- \rightarrow a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date. Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY: A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. This person must be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months. Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.
