

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

For hundreds of thousands of years before the invention of written languages, before the invention of the printing press, wisdom was passed on from generation to generation by telling stories. Modern educators are insisting that we need to re-emphasize the importance of "story telling" as the most effective method of teaching.

Today's first reading contains a powerful story, a story that teaches us something we need desperately to know, and even more to tell, that God wants us to know Him primarily as merciful and forgiving. God is all powerful, all just, all knowing. These attributes of God may fill us with awe, but they can never do as good a job in helping us to love him as does the quality of His mercy. After all, the most important work in any person's life, the very reason for which God created us is "to love Him with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength."

The story of David is fascinating. The Bible presents him as a man who was wise, kind and forgiving, and as one who truly loved God. Yet he was a person with profound weaknesses. His arranging the death of the husband of a woman for whom he lusted is about as evil as you can get. His conscience was blinded by lust. This can happen to all human beings, nor need it be just as in David's case, the lust of the flesh. Lust for power, prestige, and wealth can be even more blinding. God loved David enough to send him the prophet Samuel to open his mind and heart to the wrongs, the evils, he had done. His wonderful words, "The Lord on His part has forgiven your sin; you shall not die." This came about because his conscience was stricken. He was truly sorry.

David did not get off scot free. The old saying is true, that God does not punish us for our sins, but rather that we punish ourselves with them. His unloving and selfish behavior caused deep pain in David's life. And yet scripture tells us that God can bring good even from evil. The sorrow and anguish that David experienced in realizing his wrong doings made him a more compassionate and more forgiving person for the rest of his life. When he was an old man, his favorite son, Absalom, turned on him, even seeking to destroy him. David never stopped loving his child and held no resentment against him. On the contrary, he wept bitterly at the death of his traitor son.

This is the other facet of our need to realize the mercy of God. God asks that, as He treats us with absolute and total mercy and forgiveness, we treat each other in exactly the same manner.

Probably you have heard people who have been deeply hurt say, "I just cannot forgive them." These persons are deceiving themselves. They are really saying, "I will not forgive." Christ commanded us over and over to forgive. Jesus tells us to forgive our brother or sister who has injured us seventy times seven times a day. Jesus would never command us to do something that we are totally incapable of doing. If we are having a problem forgiving someone in our life for their treatment of us, or anyone else whom we love, the sure-fire way of doing it is to ask God's help. As St. Paul says in the second reading today, "Christ lives in each of us."

Christ's heart is in our hearts and we can always turn to that presence of Christ in us and ask Him to do the forgiving. In asking the Lord to help us be merciful, we will always experience a change of heart. God promises us that he will always turn hearts of stone into burning flames of love.

First Reading: 2 Samuel 12:7-10,13 Because God was displeased with the actions of David concerning Uriah's death in order to marry Bathsheba, God sent Nathan to reprimand David. Nathan reminds David that God anointed him King of Israel and victor over Saul. David realizes his sin against God, but Nathan continues to reveal to David that the child to be born to him shall die.

Responsorial Psalm: 32, 1-2,5,7,11 A prayer for forgiveness

Second Reading: Galatians 2:16,19-21 Paul writes of the struggles between Gentiles and Jews who both now profess belief in Christ Jesus. Paul proclaims his life in Christ, working towards unity and faith in the Son of God.



Gospel: *Luke* 7:36—8:3 While Jesus was dining at the home of a Pharisee, a woman of the city who was a sinner, came and anointed His feet with oil. Weeping, her tears fell upon Jesus' feet and she dried them with her hair. Because of the woman's respect and love, Jesus forgives her sins. This causes those present at the table to question who He is.

Family Connection

Families are familiar with the concept of an IOU. Children especially are in the habit of borrowing from one another and owing something to someone. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells a story of two people who owe different amounts of money to a creditor. One owes a small amount and the other owes a large amount. It doesn't take a rocket scientist to figure out which person will be happier about having the debt forgiven!

Talk as a family about times that various family members have borrowed from one another or owed something to one another. Share with your children the realities of being a homeowner and owing money on a house, a car, and other possessions. With these realities in mind, read aloud Luke 7:36—8:3. Discuss what it would feel like to have your debts forgiven. Talk about how, because of the forgiveness of sins we receive from Jesus, we owe a debt of gratitude to God.

Conclude by praying together the Lord's Prayer. Emphasize that the words, "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us" are sometimes translated as "forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.'

The Parish Library

When individuals strive to grow in the interior life, one of the essential spiritual exercises is spiritual reading. The Parish Library functions as part of the Adult Faith Formation Ministry at Corpus Christi Parish and provides individuals the opportunity to borrow Catholic books and resources that might not be available in public libraries or a typical bookstore. The library is located on parish grounds next to the playground area. It is a fully heated and air-conditioned modular unit with ramp access. It is comprised of unique areas for the faith formation of adults, teens, and children. Books, games, DVDs, and CDs may be borrowed for a period of three weeks and can be renewed upon request. WHAT IS ORDINARY TIME?

While the word "ordinary" in popular usage is used to describe things that are nondescript or dull, ordinary rather means customary, regular, and orderly. Ordinary Time may also be called Ordinal Time, which means numbered time. Ordinal comes from the Latin "ordinalis," which is a word meaning "showing order, denoting an order of succession." Hence, Ordinary Time is the standard, orderly, counted time outside of the other liturgical seasons. There is nothing "dull" about Ordinary Time! The liturgical color of Ordinary Time is green; however, other appropriate colors are worn on particular feast days.

Season after Pentecost or Ordinary Time after Pentecost:

The second portion of Ordinary Time begins after Pentecost and is much longer than the first. This second period of Ordinary Time lasts from the day after Pentecost through the final day before Advent. Because this portion of Ordinary Time occurs after the celebrations of Jesus's Passion, Resurrection, and Ascension, this segment of Ordinary Time is focused on the Age of the Church. The Age of the Church is the age we live in now, the time that exists between the Age of the Apostles and the second and last coming of Christ for which we are preparing. This period of Ordinary Time is also focused on Christ's reign as King of kings; the Feast of Christ the King caps off the season of Ordinary Time as the final Sunday before Advent begins.

The Blessed Sacrament is exposed every Wednesday in Corpus Christi's Chapel. Adoration starts after the 7:15 a.m. Mass until 6 p.m. Benediction follows Adoration.



BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office 215-855-1311. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month in the RE Room (in the church) i.e. June 17th, July 15th. REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized Confirmed received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent MUST be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date. Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY: A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. This person must be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.

Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.

Confessions: Saturday after 7:15AM Mass 3:15PM – 4:00PM, and also upon request at the Parish House

PRAYER GROUP: to which ALL are invited meets on Thursday evenings in the Church Chapel at 8PM.
