

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

To understand what Jesus is calling us to when He calls us to be His disciple, we first need to understand the concept of disciple. A disciple is a learner or a student. In ancient times the normal way to learn a trade or study a philosophy was to attach oneself to a master teacher. The disciple would share in the life of the master and imitate the actions and reflect the thoughts of the master. It was necessary to put one's personal life on hold in order to be attentive to the teacher. The disciple gave up family and all outside interests to focus on the good of gaining all the master had to teach. Eventually the methods of the teacher became second nature to the disciple and the transmission of knowledge or skill was complete.

When Jesus called the apostles to follow Him, He was a teacher gathering His students around Him to share His knowledge of the Father and the Father's kingdom. He called them from various professions and backgrounds and asked them to leave all to be with Him. He invited them to listen to and to learn, then to do as He did. He was a new kind of rabbi speaking with a new kind of authority, an authority that came from God Himself. Jesus' requirements were clearly stated. He said, "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." He also said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." Even family ties and obligations should not distract one from proclaiming the kingdom of God. Scripture tells us that not everyone Jesus called was moved to become a disciple. The rich man in Matthew's gospel was unable to meet the test of discipleship and was unwilling to give up his riches for the sake of the poor, and "he went away sad for he had many possessions". The cost of discipleship could be dear.

Before the Sanhedrin, the disciples Peter and John were moved to speak about what they had seen and heard, even under threat of severe punishment. This was the substance of all they preached and taught: to know Jesus was to know the Father, to know the Father was to share in the Father's life, the reward of the Father's fellowship is life eternal with Him. The reward Jesus promised gave Peter and John strength to endure and made the cost of their discipleship worthwhile.

There was a cost to the first disciples and there is one for us today. We must give up our self-life in order to accept Christ's life. This new life includes a cross. The cross Jesus bore carried the weight of the sins of the world. The cross each of us assumes by discipleship joins our suffering with His and makes our cross bearable. The cross for some may be pain in body, heart or mind. The cross for others may be humiliation and persecution because of the faith they profess. The cross at various times and places may even require martyrdom. The size or weight are of no importance. It is the carrying that is essential. The promise of Paradise makes the cross a joy.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Often people attend Mass at Corpus Christi Church for several years, but do not register with the parish. Others delay registering until they are asked to be a godparent or Confirmation sponsor, would like to have their own child baptized, or would like to schedule a wedding or a funeral at the parish. Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community. If you are not currently a member of our parish and live within the parish boundaries, we invite you to consider registering with us and making a commitment to the life of Corpus Christi Church. Register at the Parish Office Center, Monday-Friday, from 9am to 5pm or give us a call at 215-855-1311 between those hours if unable to visit in person.



We now offer our parishioners Electronic Giving as a method of making regular monthly offerings to our church. The way this is done is that you would make your monthly offerings by way of direct payments (ACH debits) from your checking/savings account on the 20th of each month (unless on a weekend or holiday in which case it will be deducted on the next business day).

You will continue to receive envelopes which will include special second collections as well as Christmas and Easter. The weekly envelopes will allow you to mark that you have chosen the electronic method for your offerings to Corpus Christi. One of the gifts Pope Francis extols, is the gift of hospitality. In our families, in our church, we have the ability to open the door and make others feel welcome. A familiar Irish expression reads "A Hundred Thousand Welcomes."

Elisha the prophet in the Book of Kings, was offered hospitality by a wealthy woman, and she was rewarded for her gift. The person ready and willing to give ONLY a cup of cold water in the name of Jesus to a little one will not go without a reward.

In the past it was not common to see people carrying a water bottle in public. Sometimes we looked for a fountain for a drink. Maybe the gift of water and hospitality for us can be welcoming a stranger, assisting someone in need, listening to a person who has suffered a loss or suffering a sickness. Whatever gesture I offer can be the Elisha gesture and the water offering which might seem small, but does not go unrewarded.

- Participate through the Catholic Youth Swim League (CYSL) which includes 16 parishes in Bucks, Montgomery and NE Philly. The CYSL has over 1,100 swimmers and has existed for over 35 years.
- The season will run from late September through February.
- Practices will be 1 to 2 nights per week at the Indian Valley YMCA or other nearby pool.
- There will be 7 dual meets and a Championship meet at LaSalle University. All meets will be on Saturday or Sunday.
- Grades are K through 8th.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, **parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.**

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. July 17th, August 21st.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered, practicing member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.**

Certificates of eligibility* must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

****CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months*

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.**
