PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

In today's gospel reading, Luke continues Jesus' "journey narrative." The narrative combines several journeys and incorporates several statements of Jesus, making the journey a symbolic one. In this way, the journey is not only Jesus' journey, but also ours through the mystery of His cross, death and resurrection.

Jesus actually went to Jerusalem, but for many of us who will never make an actual journey to Jerusalem, the journey takes on a symbolic meaning - the way by which we follow Jesus through death to new life, even here on earth.

Jerusalem is an actual geographical place where our faith rests on what really happened in the ministry of Jesus. But for many of us, followers of Jesus, it is much more than a geographical location. It becomes the way by which we follow Jesus as His disciples. We relive the great redemptive deeds of Jesus in the Holy City, even if we have never made the journey to Jerusalem.

It seems that Luke's "journey narrative" is trying to make us realize that it is our journey through life as well, so that the passion and death of Jesus becomes a living, transforming reality for us.

While on His journey to Jerusalem, the meaning of some of Jesus sayings were difficult to comprehend. He reprimanded His disciples against anger and revenge, and even though we can understand and accept this admonition, we quickly forget when hard times assail us. In His next statement to a prospective follower, (that is, to us) Jesus says that ". . . the Son of Man has nowhere to lay His head." And we sometimes wonder if we can understand and live this type of life. His third statement seems so cold and harsh. "Let the dead bury the dead; come away and proclaim the kingdom of God."

As Christians we keep our minds and hearts turned toward eternal life. We realize that ours is an apostolate of life; that our family extends to all throughout the world; that we do not labor over the mistakes of the past or its glories, but that we continue to strive and work for the coming of the kingdom of God.

St. Paul points out how we can make a good judgement by saying, "it was for liberty that Christ freed us." All law and external pressures are secondary to the realization that our lives flow primarily from the presence of Jesus, whose life, death and resurrection direct us to how we can deny ourselves in order to live more abundantly as God's new creation.

We ". . .have been called to live in freedom. . ." not the freedom of living according to our human weaknesses and selfishness, but in freedom to live the fulfillment of the whole law; that is, to love our neighbor as we love ourselves.

If we live according to the Spirit, we are guided by the Spirit. We will be able to act spontaneously and be assured that God is with us, and that we are doing His will. If we keep Christ ever before us, we will respond to every situation in peace and with good judgement. As His followers He will show us the path to life and give us fullness of joy in His presence.

First Reading: *Isaiah 66:10-14c* Isaiah instructs the people of Jerusalem to rejoice, because God would restore her prosperity. The people will better understand God's power through their homeland's restoration.

Responsorial Psalm: *Psalm 123:1-4* Our eyes are fixed on the Lord.



Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18 Paul describes the sign of the cross of Jesus as all that is significant. Following the old laws is unimportant. Instead, being baptized in Christ and adhering to His ideals is what matters most.

Gospel: *Luke* 10:1-12,17-20 Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach His good news, telling them "the harvest is rich, but the workers few." He also gave them detailed instructions on how to act towards the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.

Family Connection

Families teach a sense of togetherness and community. It is in the family that we learn that we are dependent on one another and where we learn to work together and live together. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus sends out the 72 disciples in pairs, a sign that we are to work together to serve the mission of the Kingdom of God.

Talk about all the ways that your family works together. Talk about the various chores and tasks that family members work on together to accomplish in order to keep the household running smoothly.

Read aloud Luke 10:1-12,17-20. Talk about why it was important that Jesus sent His disciples out in pairs. Discuss ways that your family can work more closely together to support one another and to make the household run more smoothly. Pray for the strength to overcome the temptation to be too individualistic and to recognize the need for working together as a family.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are* required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e., July 15th, August 19th.

REOUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and \rightarrow receive a Certificate of Eligibility* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized Confirmed and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent MUST be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date. Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY: A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. This person must be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months. Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.
