
Mission Statement for the Parish of Corpus Christi

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today's reading from the prophet Zechariah says, "The warrior's bow shall be banished, and He (the Savior) shall proclaim peace to the nations." In the Old Testament, we hear of anointed kings doing battle with their enemies. Peace is brought about by the military defeat of one's enemies. As the scriptures unfold, the prophets reveal the idea that true peace is not brought about by the use of force and war.



True peace is found in the heart of a peaceful person. Jesus tells us that we must love our enemies and do good to those who hate us. The spiritual idea of peace is now fully separated from the military idea of peace. The emperors of Rome brought temporary peace into the world. It was, however, peace that was brought about by the defeat of one's enemies and maintained by military power and might. The civil authorities, from the time of the Greeks and the Romans to the present day, continue to believe that peace can only be maintained by the use of power.

As Christians, we stand in contradiction to the idea that peace can be brought about by the use of arms, or that peace can only be maintained by military force or the warring of nations. We stand as deviants from a popular philosophy. We probably stand alone as we proclaim the message that love of God and our neighbor will bring peace. Though this neighbor may hate us or seek to destroy our culture or our religion, this is the neighbor with whom we must share the peace of the Lord.

Matthew reminds us that it is to the humble and the peaceful that the full revelation of the Son will be made. Recall the story of the camel trying to pass through the eye of the needle, and Jesus telling the people that it is harder for a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven. Today's gospel reminds us that it is hard, very hard, for those driven by power to know the true peace of Christ. More often than not, it is the humble and downtrodden who allow themselves to be open to the movement of grace which brings peace. These are the people who will convert the world by loving their neighbor, rather than killing their enemy. It is hard for those in power to accept that true peace can come about through a spiritual revolution. It is hard for them to surrender their riches or their power because they believe they can achieve much more through their use.

Do we issue laws in our homes and enforce them because we are more powerful than the members of our family? We cannot forget the words of Zechariah, "The warrior's bow shall be banished, and He shall proclaim peace to the nations," followed by Matthew's words in today's gospel, "Father, Lord of heaven and earth, to You I offer praise; for what You have hidden from the learned and the clever You have revealed to the merest children."

PARISH REGISTRATION

We now offer our parishioners Electronic Giving as a method of making regular monthly offerings to our church. The way this is done is that you would make your monthly offerings by way of direct payments (ACH debits) from your checking/savings account on the 20th of each month (unless on a weekend or holiday in which case it will be deducted on the next business day).

You will continue to receive envelopes which will include special second collections as well as Christmas and Easter. The weekly envelopes will allow you to mark that you have chosen the electronic method for your offerings to Corpus Christi. "At that time Jesus exclaimed: 'I give praise to You Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although You have hidden these things from the wise and the learned You have revealed them to the little ones. Yes, Father, such has been Your gracious will... Come to Me all you who labor and are burdened and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon your shoulders for I am meek and humble of heart and you will find rest for yourselves.'"

Recently while watching a film clip with youth in a bible study, it was clear that they had a greater understanding of the message than I. They saw things, images, heard music, which revealed a deeper meaning and understanding of the lesson at hand. Yes, God does reveal to the childlike things which often pass us by.

The message for all of us is to place our trust and confidence in the Lord and in responding to His call, learn from Him and the little ones. He reveals Himself as meek and humble, two of the beatitudes which we are called to live. As the minister translated the beatitudes at the inauguration 'God blesses the poor in Spirit, God blesses the meek, God blesses the humble... He surely does.'

Catholic Diocese of Sultanpet

NEW DIOCESE OF SULTANPET, INDIA

My diocese was newly created in February, 2014. It is a new Latin Catholic Diocese among the majority of the Syrian Catholics in that State of Kerala. This new diocese *is a border area* touching two political States of India: Kerala and Tamil Nadu. This is the 167th Catholic diocese of India. There are 55 priests (30 Diocesan and 25 religious priests) and **32,000** Latin Catholics out of the total population of 2,809,934.

Area: The area of my diocese is in general composed of rocky land and hilly land and rough soil not much suitable for good cultivation. In general the whole area is very dry, having scanty rainfalls- not gaining either from the north east monsoon or from the south west monsoon. For four months (February - May) in the year, people of this area suffer from lack of water both for drinking and irrigation. Unlike the main land of Kerala, this area is full of rocks and so the heat adds to the misery of the people.

The People: The people in this new diocese are migrants from inside another southern State of India (Tamilnadu). As Catholic Christians they migrated to this area on account of famine in their area and settled in this area. Hence they are minorities linguistically, ethnically and religiously. The situation of the Latin Catholics in this State are looked down (upon) by others as we are economically, culturally and educationally poor. The people of this area are looked down (upon) as downtrodden. They are considered as second class citizens in the State. The people of this new diocese, Sultanpet, are of casual laborers; they spend their daily wages in food, dress and alcohol and some are even driven to drugs. Immorality among the people is very common, this leads to growth of AIDs and other sex related (diseases in) patients. There is no saving mentality. Hence they do not spend much for the higher education of their children. Most of the children drop out or stop with high school. Hence they are unable to compete with others in securing Governmental or institutional jobs.

Status of Women: Women have lower status with reference to power and influence than men in all spheres of life – family, community, religion and politics. It is believed and practiced mostly that up to marriage, she is protected by her parents, during married life, she is looked after by her husband, and after the death of her husband, she was used to spend(ing) remaining years of her life under the roof of her children without any will or desire and rights in the family. A daughter began to be regarded as curse. As the girls will be married to another family, they, in general, are not sent for higher studies by their parents.

Children: Children in my diocese are in a very vulnerable situation. As the parents are not much educated they do not help their children to do their studies. There is only one diocesan school and (the) rest are Government owned schools where there (are) neither catechism nor moral studies. Hence the morality and personality building is very much lacking. Also the number of school drop-outs is increasing year after year. Several parishes need to be bifurcated and so need to build chapels, presbyteries social service units. There are some companies where our Catholics are not given jobs since they do not come up to the educational or professional requirements of these companies.

Priorities: As a new diocese, responsible for the welfare of the people, as Pope Francis emphasizes, we are to go to the periphery of the society, trying to give encouragement, uplift in the society and self-improvement. In particular, we give and wish to continue to give:

1. Awareness programme against the social evils of alcohol, drugs for men. Awareness and self-empowerment and self-respect programme for women.
2. For children: Encourage them to pursue **their education**, start tuition centers, as far as possible, in all the parish communities.
3. We have many poor and underprivileged girls and boys in order to educate them, keeping them in our own girls home and boys home.
4. We also have to take care of many orphan boys and girls who are kept in three centres. We look after their board, lodging and studies
5. Formation of seminarians, the future priests.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311*. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e. July 17th, August 21st.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.** Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

***CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married, marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.*

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.**
