

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today's readings give us a solid reason for living a life of charity and humility. In the first reading, Sirach provides us with ways to be loved by others and also to find favor with God. "Conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than the giver of gifts." "Humble yourself the more," he continues, "and you will find favor with God." Sirach was not speaking about a false humility that expresses itself in a groveling and debasing manner regarding our own selves. This would not be humility. It would be what the world calls "humility with a hook". It is false pride, for within our hearts we would be saying, "See how good I am because I am poor and lowly." Actually, thinking and speaking like this is an insult to God. God is the giver of life and of all good things.

God created us with special gifts and talents, and not to acknowledge them as such would be wrong. We are made in God's image and likeness. How can we, in true humility debase God's gifts or speak degradingly about who and what we are? True humility acknowledges the beautiful gift we are as a person – a child of God. We must claim our gifts and talents and use them to the best of our ability for the honor and glory of God. We must own completely everything about ourselves. Yet basic to this, we acknowledge God as the giver of our gifts and talents. Therefore, we give God credit for the good that we are and the good that we do.

We certainly must be able to admit truthfully our own sinfulness and weaknesses. We realize we are human and capable of sin and, perhaps, we do not feel "worthy" of the given gift, but we know that we are loved, faithfully and unconditionally, by God. We must continue to strive daily to overcome our sinfulness and weaknesses – to be who and what God wants us to be. We acknowledge that we are but earthen vessels holding the gifts and talents given us by our Creator. They are to be used for God's greater honor and glory. With God's help this is possible.

When we begin to think and act in a humble way, we will experience a difference in the way we deal with others. We will have a healthy respect and a deep appreciation for their gifts and talents. We will be able to acknowledge their giftedness in all humility and with respect, appreciating their goodness. This way of thinking and acting is true humility. This way of living and acting will find favor with God.

In the gospel reading today, we hear what Jesus said about those who consider themselves better than others. We are reminded that if we exalt ourselves over others, we shall be humbled. But if we humble ourselves, then we shall be exalted – not just by others, but also by God. We are asked to be generous to those who cannot repay us for our goodness to them. In this way, if we have the right attitude in our generosity, we will give what we can to others, not to be repaid or thanked, but as glory to God. If we do good only to those who can repay us, we have received our reward here on earth. It is only when we do good to those who cannot repay us, that our reward will be great in heaven.

Our true humility rests with the knowledge that no matter how much we have in our banks, in our homes, in our workplaces, we are poor indeed, for we need each other. This is the way a truly humble person accepts responsibility, acts upon it, and therefore works for the greater honor and glory of God.

First Reading: *Sirach* 3:17-18,20,28-29 Those who are humble will find favor with God. Everyone should realize that there is much we can learn from each other. Even the most knowledgeable people need to be humble enough to know that they can still learn from others.

Responsorial Psalm: *Psalm 68:4-7,10-11* The just rejoice and exult before God



Second Reading: Hebrews 12:18-19,22-24 The Hebrews are informed that they are not approaching an untouchable mountain etched with gloom and fear. Rather, they have neared "the city of the living God, Jerusalem." The Hebrews have approached a joyful gathering of angels, God our judge, and Jesus, who brought us a new covenant.

Gospel: Luke 14:1,7-14 Jesus went to share a meal with one of the leading Pharisees when He noticed other guests competing for places of honor at the table. He warned that a guest who takes the place of honor may be asked to move to the lowest place. Yet a guest who takes the lowest place is honored when a better position is offered by their host. He then added, "He who humbles himself will be exalted."

Family Connection

Parents and children often enter into "negotiations" over how much allowance is to be earned at certain ages. Typically, when a child seeks an increase in allowance, parents will attach an increase in chores and responsibilities for them to better earn the increase. Talk about what kind of allowance you received as a child and what kind of responsibilities your parents expected of you to earn your allowance.

Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus talks about doing good deeds for others and expecting nothing in return. Read aloud Luke 14:1,7-14. Ask your children how they would feel if you told them to take on more chores without ever expecting another raise in allowance. Emphasize that Jesus teaches us that it is our duty as his followers to take care of the needs of others and to do so without expecting repayment. Discuss what other types of rewards we can find when doing good things for others.

Point out that we sometimes fall into the trap of wanting too many things and that, in the Our Father, we pray for "our daily bread," meaning that we pray for only that which we really need in life. Conclude this time together by praying aloud the Our Father.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. September 16th, October 21st.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS must be a registered, practicing member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class

must have completed his/her 16th birthday

must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance

if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage

cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized

the godparents are to be one male and one female

one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent MUST be Catholic

a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.

Certificates of eligibility* must have a parish seal and cannot be

faxed; they must be the original.

*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY: A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months. Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today's readings give us a solid reason for living a life of charity and humility. In the first reading, Sirach provides us with ways to be loved by others and also to find favor with God. "Conduct your affairs with humility, and you will be loved more than the giver of gifts." "Humble yourself the more," he continues, "and you will find favor with God." Sirach was not speaking about a false humility that expresses itself in a groveling and debasing manner regarding our own selves. This would not be humility. It would be what the world calls "humility with a hook". It is false pride, for within our hearts we would be saying, "See how good I am because I am poor and lowly." Actually, thinking and speaking like this is an insult to God. God is the giver of life and of all good things.

God created us with special gifts and talents, and not to acknowledge them as such would be wrong. We are made in God's image and likeness. How can we, in true humility debase God's gifts or speak degradingly about who and what we are? True humility acknowledges the beautiful gift we are as a person – a child of God. We must claim our gifts and talents and use them to the best of our ability for the honor and glory of God. We must own completely everything about ourselves. Yet basic to this, we acknowledge God as the giver of our gifts and talents. Therefore, we give God credit for the good that we are and the good that we do.

We certainly must be able to admit truthfully our own sinfulness and weaknesses. We realize we are human and capable of sin and, perhaps, we do not feel "worthy" of the given gift, but we know that we are loved, faithfully and unconditionally, by God. We must continue to strive daily to overcome our sinfulness and weaknesses – to be who and what God wants us to be. We acknowledge that we are but earthen vessels holding the gifts and talents given us by our Creator. They are to be used for God's greater honor and glory. With God's help this is possible.

When we begin to think and act in a humble way, we will experience a difference in the way we deal with others. We will have a healthy respect and a deep appreciation for their gifts and talents. We will be able to acknowledge their giftedness in all humility and with respect, appreciating their goodness. This way of thinking and acting is true humility. This way of living and acting will find favor with God.

In the gospel reading today, we hear what Jesus said about those who consider themselves better than others. We are reminded that if we exalt ourselves over others, we shall be humbled. But if we humble ourselves, then we shall be exalted – not just by others, but also by God. We are asked to be generous to those who cannot repay us for our goodness to them. In this way, if we have the right attitude in our generosity, we will give what we can to others, not to be repaid or thanked, but as glory to God. This is the way a truly humble person accepts responsibility, acts upon it, and therefore works for the greater honor and glory of God.

First Reading: *Sirach* 3:17-18,20,28-29 Those who are humble will find favor with God. Everyone should realize that there is much we can learn from each other. Even the most knowledgeable people need to be humble enough to know that they can still learn from others.

Responsorial Psalm: *Psalm 68:4-7,10-11* The just rejoice and exult before God



Second Reading: Hebrews 12:18-19,22-24 The Hebrews are informed that they are not approaching an untouchable mountain etched with gloom and fear. Rather, they have neared "the city of the living God, Jerusalem." The Hebrews have approached a joyful gathering of angels, God our judge, and Jesus, who brought us a new covenant.

Gospel: Luke 14:1,7-14 Jesus went to share a meal with one of the leading Pharisees when He noticed other guests competing for places of honor at the table. He warned that a guest who takes the place of honor may be asked to move to the lowest place. Yet a guest who takes the lowest place is honored when a better position is offered by their host. He then added, "He who humbles himself will be exalted."

Family Connection

Parents and children often enter into "negotiations" over how much allowance is to be earned at certain ages. Typically, when a child seeks an increase in allowance, parents will attach an increase in chores and responsibilities for them to better earn the increase. Talk about what kind of allowance you received as a child and what kind of responsibilities your parents expected of you to earn your allowance.

Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus talks about doing good deeds for others and expecting nothing in return. Read aloud Luke 14:1,7-14. Ask your children how they would feel if you told them to take on more chores without ever expecting another raise in allowance. Emphasize that Jesus teaches us that it is our duty as his followers to take care of the needs of others and to do so without expecting repayment. Discuss what other types of rewards we can find when doing good things for others.

Point out that we sometimes fall into the trap of wanting too many things and that, in the Our Father, we pray for "our daily bread," meaning that we pray for only that which we really need in life. Conclude this time together by praying aloud the Our Father.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. September 16th, October 21st.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS must be a registered, practicing member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class

must have completed his/her 16th birthday

must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance

if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage

cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized

the godparents are to be one male and one female

one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent MUST be Catholic

a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.

Certificates of eligibility* must have a parish seal and cannot be

faxed; they must be the original.

*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY: A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months. Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.
