PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Once we accept God as the all-loving, all-knowing, all-powerful director of our lives, we can relax and know we are in the best of hands. It is when we fight against this process that we become frustrated, angry, frightened and stressed. Even Jesus, the Son of God, followed the will of the Father, teaching us to let God's love take control of our lives.

There
is in
my heart
a burning
fire



All three of today's readings show God as the Great Director. Jeremiah is angry with God because people mock at his prophecies and refuse to listen to his warnings to reform. Jeremiah tries to suppress the word of God by not preaching, but finds that he cannot resist the strength of his calling. He finds things become even worse when he does not follow the Lord's direction. You can sense the agony of Jeremiah's words: "It becomes like fire burning in my heart, imprisoned in my bones; I grow weary holding it in, I cannot endure it." His relief comes only in doing what God has directed him to do. This is how it is for those who are in tune with the plan of God for them.

Many times God's plan is not very clear to us. For those who are still searching for what it is God wants, Paul, in his letter to the Romans, provides this advice: "Offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship . . . and be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may discern what is the will of God." Paul's attitude was changed by his conversion from persecutor to disciple. God led Paul's ministry throughout much of the Roman world. To discern God's will may appear to be a tall order for us; but if we keep in mind that it is God we are surrendering to, can we doubt that the result will be a good one?

Finally, in the Gospel, Matthew shows how even Jesus followed the plan set out for Him by the Father. The plan called for Jesus to submit Himself to suffering and death at the hands of the priests and scribes. He calls Peter, "Satan" when the disciple wants to change the plan and make things easier for his beloved friend and Lord. This was not to be. Jesus was to be an example for all His followers. As He obeyed the will of God, even to death, He expected the same from those who followed Him.

Sometimes our family and friends will try to advise us that a plan other than God's is easier or better for us. That is when we must pray for direction or ask if we are "thinking not as God does, but as human beings think". If we have given over our lives to the will of God, then we will have the strength to make the right decisions.



HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

"I urge you brothers and sisters... Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind that you may discern what is the will of God, what is good, pleasing and perfect... Then Jesus said to His disciples 'Whoever wishes to come after Me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow Me.'"

One of the most difficult tasks for our parents is to bring the saving message of Jesus to their children. In an age when values, customs and traditions are challenged, what is important for families and parents is often rejected or even scorned. St. Paul's message certainly does not conform to this attitude. We are asked to be renewed and seek – 1. what is good, not just what I want to satisfy myself, 2. what is pleasing to God and to others, and 3. what is perfect, as we try to follow the way of the Lord.

The challenge never ends, but requires us to change and look for ways the gospel values become part of our daily living. Perhaps the secret for all of us is to find ourselves, praying, reflecting and asking what is the will of God for me, for us, in our particular circumstance. Unfortunately, we often forget to ask His help and go it alone. Yes, we deny self when we say 'yes' to the Lord, we embrace whatever comes our way, and determine once again to follow Him more closely.



Corpus Christi CYO Swim Team Info 2017

Corpus Christi CYO is starting a Swim Team this year. Children in grades K-8 who are members of Corpus Christi, St. Stanislaus and St. Maria Goretti parishes are eligible to join the Swim Team. Below are some details on the program. Registration is open now at <https://corpus-christi-cyo.siplay.com/site/>. Registration will remain open until Friday, Sep. 15th. Practices will start the first week in Oct. and the season will run through the end of February. There will only be a few weeks of overlap with the fall sports, so there should be minimal conflicts.

- Our team will participate in the Catholic Youth Swim League (CYSL) which includes 16 parishes in Bucks, Montgomery and NE Philly. The CYSL has over 1,100 swimmers and has existed for over 35 years.
 - The CYO Registration fee is \$100 per swimmer. Because practices will be held at the Lansdale YMCA, a membership will be required for each swimmer payable to the YMCA. The current rate is \$23/month (\$115 for 5 months plus \$35 joining fee) per child (there are also family rates available). Families that already have an existing membership, will not need an additional one. If you need to purchase a membership, wait until CYO provides additional information as we might be able to have the \$35 joining fee waived.
 - Practices will be at the Lansdale YMCA on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7:00-8:30pm. The younger children should be finished by 8:00pm. We will have the entire pool which is 25 yards, 4 lanes.
 - There will be 7 dual meets at various locations in Philly, Bucks and Montco and a Championship meet at LaSalle University. All meets will be on Saturday or Sunday.
 - Corpus is responsible for hosting two dual meets. We are tentatively scheduled to have these at St. Joseph's Univ., or a closer location.
 - Grades are K through 8th. All children must be able to swim prior to joining the team. They must be able to swim one lap (25 yards). Any swimmers whom the coaches evaluate as not ready for this season, will have their registration fee refunded.
 - All levels of swimmers are welcome and all 4 strokes will be taught.
 - We will need a significant number of volunteers for practices and meets. Every family will be required to help in some capacity.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, **parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.**

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. September 18th, October 16th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered, practicing member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.**

Certificates of eligibility* must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

****CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months*

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.**
