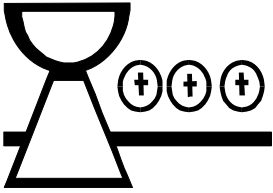

# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

How like our world was the world of Habakkuk! You would think he was reading our newspapers, listening to and watching our television, and driving through our cities when he wrote. We, too, are faced with violence, misery, strife, and discord all around us. Even where we rejoiced to see repressive governments fall, there are now new struggles and destruction. People are without work, without homes, and without resources to change their situation. Anger fuels violence, strife, and discord.

Habakkuk expresses his anger, his disappointment, his distress that God seems not to hear his prayer, that God does not intervene and remedy the situation. His relationship with God must be a strong one to be able to support the sharing of such angry feelings, particularly, since they are directed at God. His image of God must be one that allows him to voice such strong feelings. We would find it difficult to imagine voicing similar feelings so directly with very many people in our lives.


But God does not scold Habakkuk for his expression of his feelings. God answers his prayer; probably not the way Habakkuk imagined or wanted, but God was not silent. God told him to write down the vision clearly so that all could see. Trust this vision because it will come. It may not come right away but it is worth waiting for. What is this vision that will sustain us when we are faced with similar situations?

In the gospel, Jesus has been talking to the disciples about God's vision for the world. He talks about a world where the poor are cared for, where neighbors forgive one another seven times a day, where possessions are shared, and where all are accepted as precious gifts of God. The disciples seem overwhelmed by the difficulties they know they will encounter when they try to live out this vision because they ask Jesus to increase their faith. And Jesus affirms their prayers. He says that even if their faith is as tiny as a mustard seed, they can do what looks as impossible as transplanting a tree with a very extensive root system into the sea.

The readings today, then, give a way to confront the evils of our day. First, we tell God in prayer of the anger, frustration, and disappointment we experience when we look at the violence, misery, and distress of our world. Then we listen to God's invitation to adopt a way of life in which people relate to each other as friends. They share with and care for each other, a way of life in which people do not lord it over each other, or exploit each other, or claim power and wealth at each other's expense, or even cling to good things when others lack them. Then we attempt to keep the vision clear, to keep in touch with the meaning of God's promise and not allow it to be watered down without impacting our daily lives.

Sometimes, like the disciples, we feel as if it is an impossible dream, and the temptation is strong to dismiss it as just that. If we have spent any amount of time trying to establish a just and compassionate world, we know how frustrating the work can be. And so we pray with the disciples, "Lord, increase our faith."

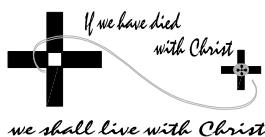

**First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4** The prophet Habakkuk cries out despairingly to God because of the state Jerusalem has fallen into. He asks why God does nothing to stop the violence and misery. God assures him that a time will come when only the just and faithful will live.

**Responsorial Psalm: PS 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9**  
**R. (8) If today you hear His voice, harden not your hearts.**

**Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14** Paul writes to Timothy from prison and urges him to continue to spread the gospel without fear or shame. He also tells Timothy to draw upon the strength of the Holy Spirit to help him face the hardships he will encounter while preaching.

**Gospel: Luke 17:5-10** The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith. Jesus replies that “faith the size of a mustard seed could transplant a sycamore,” indicating that a person either has faith, strong and complete, or none at all. Jesus also explains that a servant will not receive gratitude for simply following his master's orders. In the same way, we are all God's servants doing no more than our duty when we obey God's commands.

## HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

“**BELOVED. I remind you to stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self control. So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake, but bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God...Guard that rich trust with the help of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us...we have done what we were obliged to do.**”

Paul used an image of a fire to be stirred up, as when he first laid hands on Timothy. The same gesture was used the day we were baptized, and we too are to stir up that flame, that ardor as a disciple of the Lord.

Remember the devastating forest fires last spring in Alberta, Canada? An entire town eaten up by violent, relentless flame. While fire in California came into our homes as we watched the evening news. We can almost hear the crackling flames and smell the burning trees. The fire has power to kill, as we sadly see on television, when homes are destroyed. But the flame of faith gives life and cannot be extinguished.

Fire can give warmth and stimulate life. The fire of the Holy Spirit becomes the driving force for us to live as His witnesses. We are to guard what was entrusted to us, but not as a dog protecting his bone, but as a disciple on fire to bring Christ's warmth and love to the world. Did He not tell us He came to cast fire on the earth?

**Did you know?**

If your marriage ended in divorce, you can petition the Tribunal of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia for a Declaration of Nullity. The Tribunal is looking to see if something was lacking in the intentions of the parties in regards to children, fidelity and permanence, and/or in their understanding of marriage, and/or in their ability to enter into and fulfill marriage. Anyone can begin the process now from the ease of their own computer. Go to [www.archphila.org](http://www.archphila.org). On the top right of the web page, under the heading, “How do I”, click on the tab “Start the Annulment Process.” Follow the instructions, fill out the form on the computer, print out the form, obtain the proper documents and send everything to the Tribunal. When your application is received you will be contacted to begin your case with formal testimony. The normal annulment process takes 6 to 8 months.

**BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS:** Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, **parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.**

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. October 17th, November 21st.**

**REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS**

- must be a registered, practicing member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility\* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.**

Certificates of eligibility\* must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

**\*\*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.**

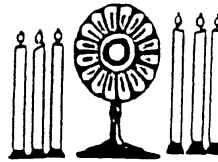
