

# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,


The call to married life is a call to holiness in the very image and likeness of God. We are told, "God is one but not solitary" and in the wedding Mass we pray that husband and wife will be "no longer two but one flesh". The Genesis story of creation shows a caring God Who recognizes the need for human companionship, one capable of sharing the hopes and fears, and the sorrows and joys of another. And so God creates a partner for the man; from the side of the man God creates woman.

However, in marriage, we know that both partners bring their own uniqueness to a relationship. Each has been touched by the goodness as well as the sin of the world. Therefore it is necessary to recognize that marriage is work. A relationship as intimate as marriage demands a life of acceptance, trust, forgiveness, and constant reconciliation. To achieve such a relationship, both parties must learn to die to self, and live for the other. And both must learn to listen for God's voice in the events of their lives. The power of the sacramental life of marriage must not be neglected.

But aren't all of these things the foundation of every relationship? The mutual affection between parents and children, the quiet understanding between friends or the loving acceptance of our neighbor, all require love, trust, and forgiveness. Love, in the image of God, must be unconditional, and only with God's help can we hope to arrive at that kind of love. In the sacramental life of marriage we have that added help: the power of the sacrament is there for the asking, to call upon whenever needed. We call that sacramental power *grace*.

In Baptism, we are called to live a spiritual life which is strengthened and nourished by the sacraments given to us by Jesus, through the Church. Each sacrament imparts its own spiritual power to help us overcome the temptations of the world, but we must remember to call on that power. It is through the presence of Jesus in the sacraments, and the work of the Holy Spirit in our hearts, that we live out our call to a sacramental life.

Perhaps it is time to remember the help that is ours, not only in the waters of Baptism, but also in the food of the Eucharist, the power of forgiveness, and in all the Sacraments. This help is there for us as we seek answers to problems in our relationships and we pray for peace within all families.

Here in Philadelphia for 143 years the **Little Sisters** have continued to welcome thousands of elderly, serving them in love with respect and dignity until death as if they were Jesus Himself. His providential care provides for us "*tangibly*" through your faithful and generous assistance.

October is Respect Life month and we are encouraged to place particular emphasis on recognizing the sanctity of life. **October 4 is Respect Life Sunday** and the Respect Life Group offers **Spiritual Adoption**, which is signing up to say a prayer for a baby so that he or she will not be aborted. Educational brochures on many subjects are also available and they are free. Stop by the table in the Narthex or RE Room after all Masses.

**First Reading: Genesis 2:18-24** God created many different animals in an attempt to make a suitable partner for the first man. Then he took a rib from the man as he slept and built it up into a woman. At last God had created someone who equaled the man, as she was "bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh" and they proved to be suitable partners for each other.

**Responsorial Psalm: PS 128:1-2, 3, 4-5, 6** *May the Lord bless us all the days of our lives.*



**Second Reading: Hebrews 2:9-11** This passage describes how Jesus will become perfect through His suffering. It also reminds us that Jesus' Father is our Father as well, making Him unashamed to call us His brothers and sisters.

**Gospel: Mark 10:2-16** The people began to ask Jesus if it was acceptable for a man to divorce his wife. Jesus tells them that two people who have been joined together by God should not be separated. People began bringing their children to Jesus, but the disciples tried to send them away. Jesus grew angry and told His disciples to allow the children to come to Him.

## Family Connection

Jesus' teaching about divorce and remarriage can be a challenging one for many people. The Church continues to uphold the strong and positive teaching of Jesus that God intends for a man and woman to make a lifelong commitment to one another in the Sacrament of Marriage. Many of us, however, know people whose marriage has not been a lifelong commitment. The example of Jesus teaches us that we are called to act with compassion and love in our relationships with all, and especially when people are hurting because of difficulties in their relationships. Most importantly, we remember that when marriages thrive, it is a sign of God's grace at work.

As you gather as a family, talk about what it means to make a promise or a commitment to someone. Offer examples of promises that are fairly easy to keep. Read today's Gospel, Mark 10:2-16. Talk about examples of promises and commitments that might be more difficult to honor, like the marriage commitment that Jesus is asked about in this Gospel. Talk about how we need God to help us honor our commitment to love and care for each other. Jesus teaches that we should be like children before God, trusting God's promise to care for us and asking for his help to keep our commitments to love and care for others. Conclude by praying together that God will give his grace to us that we may honor our commitments to one another. Pray together Saint Ignatius of Loyola's prayer, the *Suscipe*.

**BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS:** Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, **parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.**

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. October 19th, November 16th.**

**REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS**

- must be a registered, practicing member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility\* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.**

Certificates of eligibility\* must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

**\*\*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months*

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.**
