




PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Even when the feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925, kings were out of style in most of the world. After that World War II toppled most of the great dynasties and in the few kingdoms that remained the royal families were mere figureheads.

So what is the significance of the feast of Christ the King? The kingship and sovereignty of Jesus Christ has strong roots in the Scriptures. He is the Emmanuel (God-with-us) King predicted by Isaiah as coming from the royal line of David, as the Christmas Gospel tells us. The Epiphany and the Ascension of the Lord both suggest the royal kingship of Jesus. And if we echo the Gospel of Saint John faithfully, then Good Friday is our kingship feast par excellence.

The objective of Pope Pius XI in 1925 was to reassert the authority of our Lord to rule all nations, and to bring people back to Christ so as to establish "the peace of Christ in the reign of Christ." He could do this because Christ's was a different kind of kingship than the world was used to.


Today's Old Testament reading from Ezekiel testifies to the identification of a king as a shepherd in the ancient world; including Israel. The prophet says that the Lord God will personally take over shepherd duties: "I Myself will pasture My sheep . . . the lost I will seek out, the strayed I will bring back, the injured I will bind up, the sick I will heal . . ." This is truly a different king of king, a king who serves His people instead of the other way around.

The kingship of Jesus is different also in that He does not reign "over" His people as much as He reigns "among" them. This is the importance of the beautiful parable in the Gospel. All those people who had served the hungry and the thirsty, the homeless and the sick, the naked and the imprisoned were doing it for Him. This must mean that His love for them was empowering them to serve the King through others, and they were not even conscious of doing so. They were surprised when He rewarded them, saying, "When did we see You hungry or thirsty or naked or homeless?" Only at the end would His identity as the King they served be revealed, when "He will sit upon His royal throne."

The lesson for us is that we serve the King through our service to others. Blessed Teresa of Calcutta put today's gospel in terse perspective when she said, "At the end of life we will not be judged by how many diplomas we have received, how much money we have made, how many great things we have done. We will be judged by: I was hungry and you gave Me to eat – I was naked and you clothed Me – I was homeless and you took Me in. Hungry not only for bread, but hungry for love; naked not only for clothing, but naked of human dignity and respect; homeless not only for want of a room of brick, but homeless because of rejection."

It is a king in disguise that we serve, a different kind of a king. He is a King who said He came "not to be served but to serve," a King who reigns among us rather than over us. We are His eyes, His ears, His hands and by grace even a little bit of His heart. We serve Him through the least of His brothers and sisters and thereby help to establish the peace of Christ in the reign of Christ.

First Reading: Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17 This passage beautifully describes how the Lord God, as shepherd, will tend His flock. He will rescue those who are lost, bring back those who stray, heal the sick, and "pasture" all.

Responsorial Psalm: PS 23:1-2, 2-3, 5-6
R. (1) The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28 Paul once again stresses the significance of Christ's resurrection in the total divine plan, emphasizing that Christ's rising means that those who believe in Him will also rise after death. Christianity, he argues, is meaningless if it concerns only this life on earth. In the end, even death will be destroyed, and "God will be all in all."



Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46 With words both poetic and vivid, Jesus tells the disciples that since He is present in all people, whatever they do to "one of my least brothers" they do to Him; and whatever they fail to do to His "least," they fail to do to Him.

"Then the King will say to those on His right, 'Come, you are blessed by My Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave Me food. I was thirsty and you gave Me drink, a stranger and you welcomed Me, naked and you clothed Me, ill and you cared for Me, in prison and you visited Me.' Then the righteous will answer Him and say, 'Lord when...'"

It is easy to recall this teaching, the well known corporal works of mercy. It is easy to place a name and face on friends or agencies who carry out their tremendous works of service. It is easy to offer support through donations to enable others to carry out their mission.

As we reflect upon these signs of compassion and concern, and admire the dedication of those who serve the needs of others, why not ask the question that causes people to be in such vulnerable conditions. A famous Brazilian bishop once declared, 'When I take care of the poor, people praise me. When I ask why they are poor, I am called a communist.' Dom Helder Camara wants us to ask the question which leads me to help alleviate the suffering of others. It may be my active involvement in direct service or maybe indirect service through legislative action, helping understand the issues involved or both.

On this great feast of Christ the King take time to answer the question posed to Jesus and myself 'When...?'



BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.* Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e. December 18th, January 15th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.** Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

***CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married, marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.*

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.**
