PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today we begin the season of Advent and a new year in the Church. Some religious traditions like the Jesse tree and the Advent wreath help us to remember the long centuries that the Jewish people waited for the coming of the Messiah. By sharing in the long preparation for the Savior's first coming, we renew our desire, anticipation, and hope of His coming again. The prophet Isaiah, speaking in the eighth century before Christ, describes the establishment of the Lord's house as the "highest mountain" with all nations streaming toward it. This is foretelling the Second Coming of Christ which will bring about the prominence of the Lord as the center of the world. It is in the center that He "shall judge between the nations, and impose terms on many people".

Of course, we do not know when the Lord will come, but can we imagine what it would be like if that time were today? Some people would be filled with fear that the fires of damnation would be inescapable, and that God would destroy hundreds of thousands of evil people all over the world. They might even fear for themselves. They might recall each fault and failing of their lives and give in to despair. Some people see the Second Coming of Christ only in a negative light.




Let us look instead to the glory that will accompany the coming of the kingdom. There will be no more war, the world will be at peace. The instruments of war will be broken down, melted into molten metal and recast into helpful life-giving utensils. Soldiers trained to kill people will be unnecessary. It will be a culture of life not a culture of death.

God's city will be one filled with light and joy. This will be a place of comfort and happiness because God shall wipe away every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, crying out of pain, for the former world has passed away. This is to be a place where the lame walk and the blind see, where the children and the elderly will be loved and cared for. The second letter of Peter describes "new heavens and a new earth where . . . the justice of God will reside". Crime and hatred will be destroyed. Prisons will not be necessary. All people will be provided the things they need to live. Poverty and pollution will be conditions of the past. Darkness will not be a cover for sinful deeds because sin itself will be gone. Fear and shame will have no place to hide in the Lord's house..

Jesus is our anticipation during this season of Advent. He is the hope that penetrates the dark thoughts that come to us. He is a speck of light in the darkening days as winter approaches. We must wait with patience because we do not know the time or place, but we do not wait in a vacuum. We practice the virtues and qualities of life that are promised with the coming of the kingdom and we place our trust in the goodness and mercy of the Lord. We bring light where there is darkness; we bring hope where there is despair. We extend comfort where it is needed and we spread peace in times of conflict. With renewed hope we rejoice as we go to the house of the Lord.

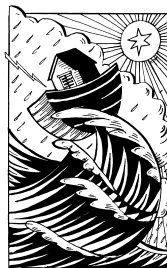

"You know the time in which we are living. It is now the hour for you to wake from sleep, for our salvation is closer than when we first accepted the faith... Let us cast off the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. Put on the Lord Jesus Christ and make no provision for the desires of the flesh."

For twenty centuries, faithful Christians have listened to and read Saint Paul's exhortation. No one can deny that his inspired word is not true. Because of the long time span though, we may have fallen asleep.

We are encouraged to begin this new period of advent with an eager enthusiasm, seeking ways to discover the presence of the Christ of history, as well as the Christ who is and is coming. Advent summons us to look with a new set of eyes at what the coming of Christ means for us in 2016.

He comes in the gift of friends. He comes in the gift of prayer. He comes from those in need who ask us to be light to overcome their darkness. As daylight grows short, may we be light for others to see that the coming of the Lord is even more important now than advent 2015. We pray the words of Revelation '**Come Lord Jesus**'.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.* Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e. December 20th, January 16th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.** Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

***CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married, marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.**
