

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

The question that John the Baptist sends his followers to ask Jesus in today's gospel has been asked by others, year after year, age after age, since the time of Christ. Is Jesus Christ truly the Messiah? Is the world redeemed? Millions of people have decided that the answer is no. It would be very difficult to answer otherwise if we were to base our response on the world of today as mirrored in any daily newspaper.

People senselessly killing others; the on-going turmoil in the Middle East; thousands dying of hunger in Africa; the constant threat of terrorism are all examples of evil. Yes, it would be difficult to make an act of faith that the Messiah, He who was to be the Prince of Peace, has truly come in the person of Jesus Christ if we were to judge only by externals.



But our Messiah, our Christ, warned us that there would be troubles. There would be famines and wars, but He urged us to hang on to our faith and our hope, for the Kingdom of God is within. For God in the person of His Messiah to have rid the world of all hatred and greed, He would have had to destroy human nature, stripping all of humanity of freedom of choice, locking us into a programmed goodness that would render our very goodness an automatic and determined response and not one chosen out of love for God and for one's fellow human beings. For there to be a mystery of goodness there must be a mystery of the capacity to do wrong.

Yes, the Kingdom of God, the peace of God, is basically an inner quality that is available to us in the midst of the worst of times and events. Truly, there is much evil in our world. There are many people who have committed themselves to the scramble for power, wealth, and pleasure, and they do not care at all who may be injured in the process.

However, the person who through faith and hope and love maintains an open and loving relationship with God and with the people in his or her life lives in a protected environment of grace. When you seek to live a life of loving care and compassion, you will not automatically be protected from experiencing grief or pain; neither was Christ Himself. In fact, Christ tells us that it is precisely through the grief and pain that results from the love of goodness that we are made strong.

When Christ said, "Blessed are they who mourn, they will be comforted," He was not speaking to us of only those times when we would be grieving the loss of a loved one by death. He also promises comfort to all who grieve when, instead of love in this life, we encounter evil and suffering.

The redeeming peace that Christ has indeed already brought to this troubled world is that peace of heart that springs from faith, hope, and love. Our faith tells us that no evil, no disaster, no cosmic tragedy, is greater nor more powerful than God. Our hope assures us that God made us for an eternity of loving fulfillment and that it is ours now in seed, and will surely come to fulfillment in God's time. This faith and this hope, more than anything else, gives us reason to love. And it is in loving ourselves and in loving each other that the peace of heaven begins here on earth.

First Reading: Isaiah 35:1-6a, 10 Isaiah tells us that when Christ comes, the weak will be made strong, the deaf will hear, the blind will see, and, above all, "sorrow and mourning will flee."

Responsorial Psalm: PS 146:6-7, 8-9, 9-10

R. (cf. Is 35:4) Lord, come and save us.



Second Reading: James 5:7-10 As the farmer waits patiently through winter and spring for the "yield of the soil" so, too, must we wait patiently for the coming of the Messiah.

Gospel: Matthew 11:2-11 While in prison, John sends a messenger to Jesus to ask, "Are you He who is to come or do we look for another?" Jesus replies by citing the miracles He has performed for the blind, the deaf, and the crippled. He concludes by identifying John as the messenger He has sent to prepare the way.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

"John in prison heard about the works Christ performed, and sent a message through his disciples to ask Him, 'Are you He Who is to come' or do we look for another?' In reply Jesus said to them: 'Go back and report to John what you hear and see: the blind...cripples... lepers... the deaf... the dead... and the poor have the good news preached to them. Blest is the man who finds no stumbling block in Me.'"

So wrapped up in the commercialism and consumerism, the question posed by John certainly is appropriate for us. Who is it we are waiting for? Who is it we are looking for? It is not just a simple, but a profound question. Where is our search leading us?

When Jesus began His mission, He used the prophet Isaiah to explain His role. The Baptist asks the question for us, and we have the answer right in front of us. We too are to go back and report to others who Jesus is for us, what He does for us. So many today are spiritually blind, or deaf, hurting and even fallen from grace. But the Christ whose coming we commemorate and celebrate in two weeks asks us to go and tell others, as did the disciples of John.

May we all 'prepare the way of the Lord.'

MARCH FOR LIFE 2017 – 44th Anniversary**

PLEASE READ: This may be the last bus trip to the March for Life from Corpus Christi unless someone comes forward to lead next year! Ellie Hentschel and I (Louise Mercurio) have run this trip for many years and we are now stepping down. If you are interested, please call Louise Mercurio at 610-584-4008.

The 44th Annual March for Life will be held on **Friday, January 27, 2017** in Washington, DC. Corpus Christi Parish will send one (1) bus to Washington to attend this peaceful and prayerful demonstration bearing witness to the dignity of human life from conception to natural death. This trip is sponsored jointly by the Respect Life Group & the Knights of Columbus Council #9715. NEW schedule for the day is as follows:

Come prepared for the day and attend 6:30 am Mass at Corpus Christi Parish, then board the bus at the RE side of Church and we will leave the CC parking lot at 7:15AM promptly.

One restroom stop on 95. Continue on to Washington where bus driver will drop us off as close to the beginning of the March as possible (near 7th and Constitution Ave.). March begins about 1 PM and we will join in and walk up Constitution (about 1 mile) toward the Capital and continue on to the Supreme Court where we pray for the end of legalized abortion (Roe vs. Wade). We then regroup at the corner and when we have all our people together, we walk to Union Station, where our bus will pick us up (4PM). We leave Washington, and stop on 95 at the Maryland House, which has been newly renovated, has plenty of seating room, and everyone will purchase their dinner from the various food places. (Old Country Buffet has closed.) We will not go to the Shrine and we will not take the Metro train.

Cost for adults is \$24 for bus. Cost for students is 0, bus is free for all students BUT an adult must accompany them. Everyone should bring a bag lunch and a drink. Bus returns to Corpus Christi by 9 PM. Sign-ups start now. Sign-up board is in the Narthex of Church and you must pay in full to reserve your seat. All deposits are transferrable, but not refundable. Make check payable to Respect Life and send to Ellie Hentschel, 2045 Pheasant Hill Road, Lansdale, PA 19446, 215-362-0160. Bring your gold scarf from previous year. New signups will get a scarf.



BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office 215-855-1311*. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled at **7:00 PM RE Room (in the church) on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. December 19th, January 16th**.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - received First Holy Communion - and *actively* practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* **MUST** be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date. Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

****CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.*

Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.

Confessions: Saturday after 7:15AM Mass 3:15PM – 4:00PM, and also upon request at the Parish House.

PRAYER GROUP: to which ALL are invited meets on Thursday evenings in the Church Chapel at 8PM.

DAILY PRAYER CHAPEL OPEN: Visits to the Blessed Sacrament during the day may be made in the Church Chapel. The Chapel is open every day from 7:45AM to 3:30PM except Wednesday when it is open until 6:30PM. Please enter the Chapel using the entrance walk on the side of the Parish House facing Supplee Road.

Certificates of Eligibility to act as a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, **cannot be issued** unless you are already (preferably for 6 months) registered with us. *Please be aware that young adults over 21 (25 if in college) should register separately.*
