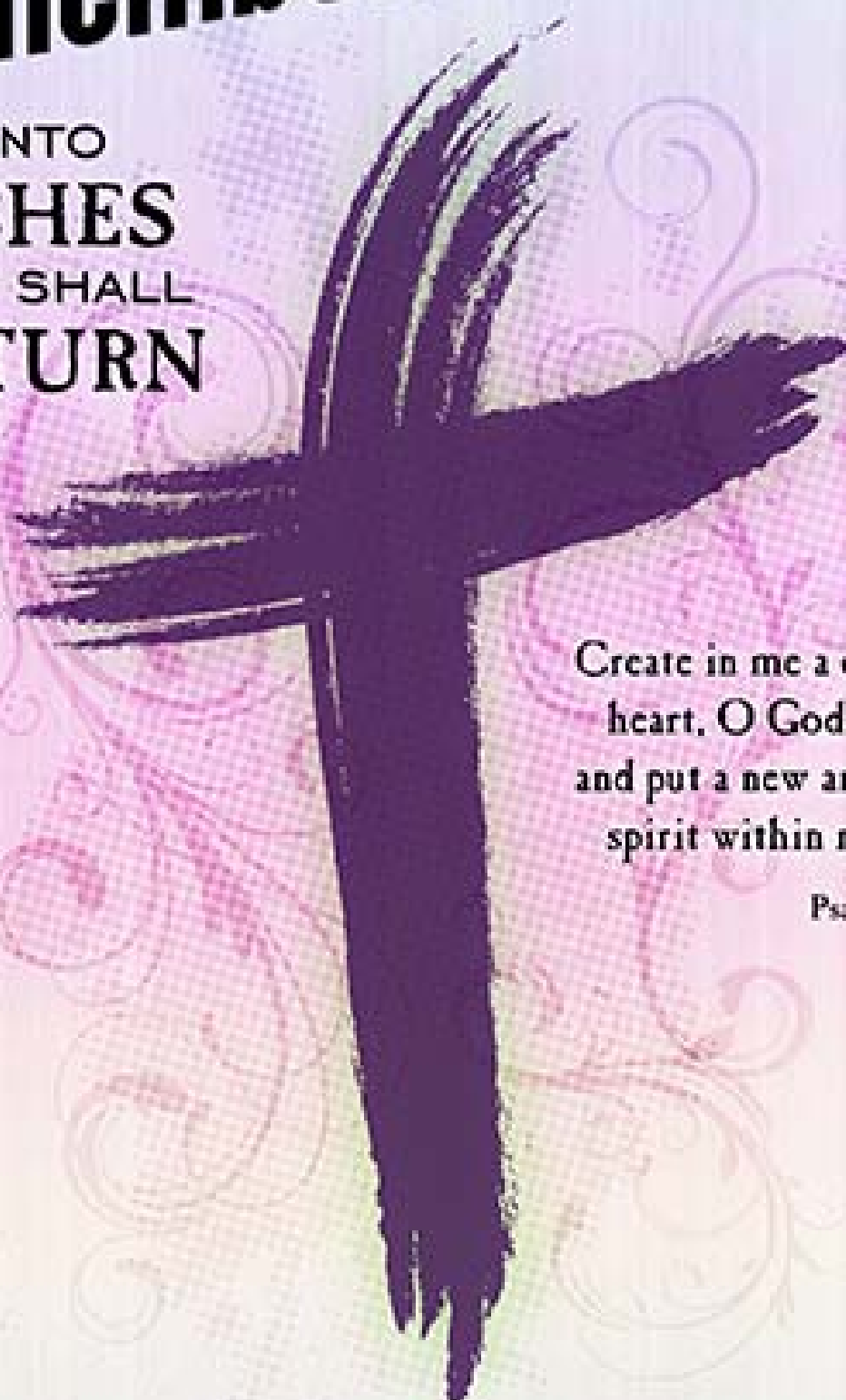

# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

It must have been a terrible thing to be a leper in biblical times. It was not exactly a death sentence but in some ways it was worse. One lived as an outcast, spurned by family, friends, and neighbors. One was doing a virtuous thing when running away from a leper even though it was very offensive to the poor leper. Saint Paul tells us in the second reading today to "avoid giving offense" to anyone. In other words, no one is to be excluded from our love, not even lepers. Jesus did not run away from the leper. Instead, "moved with pity," He cured him.

There are several lessons we can learn after hearing of this miracle of the cure of the leper. One is that the dignity of the human person is most important. We cannot give offense to any human beings, no matter their national origin, no matter the color of their skin, no matter the illness they suffer, no matter their attractiveness or the lack of it. Our Founding Fathers recognized this when they wrote the Declaration of Independence. "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness." Neither leprosy, AIDS, poverty, weakness or anything else excuses followers of Christ from treating our fellow human beings as anything other than that: human beings, created by Almighty God and endowed with great dignity and worth.



Another thought that comes to mind this week, as we celebrate Saint Valentine's Day is love, and of course, love is the greatest of all Christian virtues, Jesus told us to love our neighbor, and even our enemies and that means everyone, even lepers. But, our Saint Valentines' Day observance seems to be all about romantic love – and that is not bad – but it really is, or should be, about Christian charity. The details of the life of Saint Valentine are lost in antiquity as is the custom of sending valentines to lovers. It does appear, however, that he was a priest in Rome who was very good to those in need. And so, it is a small leap to remind all of us of our calling and our destiny as Christians to be great lovers.

We do not, or should not, give offense to anyone. Rather, we are to love our neighbor. With all the hearts and flowers around us in stores and everywhere we turn these days, should they not help us to call to mind that "love is patient; love is kind; love is not jealous; it does not put on airs; it is not snobbish. Love is never rude; it is not self-seeking. It is not prone to anger, neither does it brood over injuries."

On this Sixth Sunday in Ordinary time, when we are to mull over some lessons that the Church puts before our eyes in the readings from Sacred Scripture, these two thoughts come to mind – the dignity of the human person and the love of neighbor that flows from that dignity. These ideas should be enough to keep us thinking and praying all week and beyond.

## FAST AND ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE FOR LENT

The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that *all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday.* Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.



All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

**First Reading: *Leviticus 13:1-2, 44-46*** The Lord tells Moses and Aaron that anyone bearing the sore of leprosy must first be seen by Aaron or one of the other priests, and that as long as the sore is upon him, "He shall dwell apart, making his abode outside the camp."

### Responsorial Psalm: *PS 32:1-2, 5, 11*

**R. (7) *I turn to You, Lord, in time of trouble, and You fill me with the joy of salvation.***

**Second Reading: *1 Corinthians 10:31—11:1*** Paul instructs the Corinthians to do everything for the glory of God, to avoid offending others, and to be imitators of Christ.



**Gospel: *Mark 1:40-45*** Jesus takes pity on a leper and cures him of his disease with a warning not to say but to show himself to the priest and make an offering. Instead of remaining silent, the leper greatly publicized the healing, making it impossible for Jesus to enter the town openly.

### HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

**"A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged Him and said, 'If You wish You can make me clean.' Moved with pity, He stretched out His hand, touched him and said to him, 'I do will it. Be made clean.'"**

This week, we begin the season of Lent, a time of renewal and repentance. We have a tendency to approach this time from a traditional posture. Ashes, meatless Fridays and Stations of the Cross. All are part of our practice and tradition.

Wait a minute. Picture the lonely leper, ill and isolated, but with firm faith and determination, violating the rules imposed through Moses, approaching Jesus, seeking much needed help. I am he!

Consider for a moment what it took for him to act. He was desperate, knowing the reality of his condition. He spoke 'If You wish,...' He heard the will of Jesus, felt His compassion, was touched by the healer. I am he!

May I seriously consider how to begin Lent this year and live renewal and repentance with the leper to be healed, cleansed and enlivened. Lent is God's gift to me this year.

### THE PASSION OF OUR LORD

The month of February is traditionally dedicated to the Passion of Our Lord in anticipation of the liturgical season of Lent. In this month, we begin to meditate on the mystery of Jesus' sufferings which culminated in his death on the Cross for the redemption of mankind. Saints who had a special devotion to Christ's passion include St. Francis of Assisi, who was the first known saint to receive the stigmata; St. John of the Cross; St. Bridget of Sweden; and St. Catherine of Siena.

**BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS:** Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office 215-855-1311*. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled at **7:00 PM RE Room (in the church) on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. February 19th, March 19th.**

## REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - received First Holy Communion - and *actively* practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility\* **MUST** be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date. Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

**\*\*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.*

Baptism is administered at 12:30 PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.

**Confessions:** Saturday after 7:15AM Mass 3:15PM - 4:00PM, and also upon request at the Parish House.

Certificates of Eligibility to act as a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, **cannot be issued** unless you are already (preferably for 6 months) registered with us. **Please be aware that young adults over 21 (25 if in college) should register separately.**
