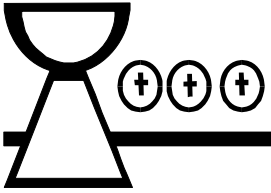

# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

What does Lent mean to us? How do we view Lent? Do we see Lent as a special time to bond with Christ?

Think of Lent as a new beginning. We generally and rightfully associate Lent with penance, but the notion of “beginning anew” should also be the theme for our Lenten observance. Beginning anew means turning away from our sinful past and turning to God with new love, new purpose, new sincerity, new strength, and new commitment. Beginning anew means conversion. Conversion signals an about-face (a 180 degree turn) from sin to God.

The challenge of Lent is two-fold: to give up evil, to turn away from those things that prevent us from loving God as fully as we can, and to do those things that more clearly express our love for God and neighbor.

Recall the ashes placed on our foreheads on this past Ash Wednesday. To have a new beginning we must leave the past in ashes, the ashes of our pride, the ashes of our sinful habits, the ashes of our Mardi Gras mentality, the ashes of our old self. Scripture says, “Come back to the Lord with all your heart, leave the past in ashes.” When it comes to sin, we need to burn the bridges behind us.



Today's first reading from Genesis speaks of a new beginning, a new covenant that God made with Noah and his sons after the disastrous flood. The first covenant had been shattered by human sinfulness. God was grieved by the enormity of sin and the flood was a divine reaction. But there was a note of hope – Noah found favor with God.

God forgives and the past is done with. God takes the initiative. God comes to Noah and his family and forms a new covenant with them and their descendants. God is saying – let us forget the past; we will begin anew with peace between me and all of creation; the rainbow will be its sign.

We need to forget the past and begin anew. This is precisely what happens when we go to the Sacrament of Confession. A new beginning is possible because God helps us. Christ has given us all that we need to turn to Him: The Sacrament of Penance to reconcile us; Bread from Heaven to strengthen us; the Inspired Word in the Bible to motivate us; His Church to support us; and most of all His love, strength, and mercy as evidenced by the Crucifix. God seeks us out to help us have a new beginning.

The Gospel today tells us of Jesus' forty days in the desert. This forty day period of Christ fasting and praying in the desert is the origin of our forty day Lenten season. The Gospel also mentions Christ's appearance in Galilee and the initiation of His preaching. This too, was a new beginning. “The reign of God is at hand!” Reform your lives and believe in the Good News.” Let us reform and make a new beginning. This is what Lent is all about.

**First Reading: Genesis 9:8-15** God made a promise to Noah that He would never again devastate the entire planet with a flood. He also told Noah that the symbol of this promise would be a rainbow in the clouds.

**Responsorial Psalm: PS 25:4-5, 6-7, 8-9.**

**R. (cf. 10) Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth to those who keep Your covenant.**

**Second Reading: 1 Peter 3:18-22** This letter from Peter reminds all people that Christ died for us so that we might be led to God. We have been saved by our baptism; not a physical cleansing, but a promise to continually strive to obey God.



**Gospel: Mark 1:12-15** Mark briefly tells of Jesus' stay in the desert, where He was tested by Satan. He did not give in to temptation, but reappeared in Galilee to proclaim the good news.

### HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

*“Beloved, Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that He might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, He was brought to life in the Spirit... This prefigured baptism, which saves you now.... ‘The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent and believe in the gospel.’”*

Lent, often described as a journey, is the opportunity for all to come closer to the Lord. In a baptismal sermon Peter tells us that the suffering of Christ, which we recall during these days of prayer, has but one purpose to lead us to God. It is not what I do, but the work of the Lord, bringing me on my desert journey. The gospel tells us Jesus was led by the Spirit for His desert experience to announce that the kingdom is at hand.

God's word spoke of a special moment in time, a moment which speaks to me today. Lent is that special time for me to meet the Lord in a new and different way. Through the threefold steps of prayer, sacrifice and good works, the kingdom becomes more present for me.

### THE PASSION OF OUR LORD

The month of February is traditionally dedicated to the Passion of Our Lord in anticipation of the liturgical season of Lent. In this month, we begin to meditate on the mystery of Jesus' sufferings which culminated in his death on the Cross for the redemption of mankind. Saints who had a special devotion to Christ's passion include St. Francis of Assisi, who was the first known saint to receive the stigmata; St. John of the Cross; St. Bridget of Sweden; and St. Catherine of Siena.

**BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS:** Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311*. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e. February 19th, March 19th.**

#### **REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS**

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility\* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility\* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.** Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

**\*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married, marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.*

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.**
