PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Parishioners,

The Easter message, the revelation from Christ to us today, **“Behold I make all things new!”** is found in the twenty-first chapter of the Book of Revelation.



The short second reading from Saint Paul speaks of new yeast. Today, when unknown hands make our bread in large factories, this symbol loses its meaning. It would have had more meaning to many of our grandparents who made their kitchens smell good with fresh baked bread. But even they possibly bought their yeast at a grocery store. In Christ's time each housewife would have had a special crock of yeast in her kitchen for her fresh bread baking. In the course of a year there were strange elements from the air itself that found their way into her yeast pot and began to alter the taste of the bread. Once a year, in the Spring, the yeast crock was cleaned out and a new batch was started, pure, clean and fresh. Easter tells us that this can, and must, happen in each of our hearts and minds, not just once a year, but on a daily basis.

Another Easter symbol has been kept alive through the centuries. Those who attend the Easter Vigil experience it. All of the lights in the Church are put out. The celebrant lights the new fire, blesses it, and lights the new paschal candle, the symbol of the Risen Christ. The flame lighting up the darkness in the church symbolizes Christ, the Light of the world. In our day of electric lights, it is hard for us to realize how important it was in the homes of our ancestors to keep some small fire going. In northern climates fire meant life itself. But through the Christian centuries all fire was extinguished on Good Friday for the “Light of the World” was out. The new Easter fire was struck to symbolize that in the risen Christ there is a new and eternal living flame that gives light and warmth to our lives in a cold and dark world.

We are made in the image and likeness of God who is complete and total love. It is the flame of love, and love alone, that provides the light and the warmth that gives light and warmth to our lives. But we are surrounded by “strange elements,” both within and without, that tend to turn our love to selfishness or anxiety, which puts out the light and warmth in our lives. Selfishness and anxiety make the bread of our lives bitter. Even Christ, as a human was tempted by these strange elements.

The night before the crucifixion, as we heard during Holy Week, He pulled back from the sacrifice of His own life that His Father asked of Him. He overcame those anxieties, that reluctance to make the ultimate act of love, that is, laying down His life by asking the Father to help Him. He received that help, and through His death entered a new and glorious eternal life. The same can and must happen to us.

Easter tells us that. It tells us that through asking our Father, who is the same as Christ's Father, daily to help us overcome our anxieties, our fears, our reluctance to love until death, we like Christ will be made new. These are inside deaths and inside resurrections that go on all the time in our hearts and minds throughout the days of our lives on earth. Easter is God's way of telling us, “Don't be afraid of your little crosses

First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43 Peter discusses Jesus' life of preaching and healing. Jesus was crucified, then He rose up and was seen by His chosen witnesses. Peter also mentions the importance of all the disciples bearing witness to what they saw, so that many people would believe in Jesus, and have their sins forgiven through Him.

Responsorial Psalm: PS 118:1-2, 16-17, 22-23 *This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad.*

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4 Paul asserts that we must pay attention to higher realms rather than earthly concerns. Our life is not yet completely known to us, until Christ appears and we are raised to glory in Him.



Gospel: John 20:1-9 When Mary Magdalene discovered Jesus' tomb was open, she told Simon Peter and another disciple. They ran to the tomb and Peter went inside. He found the burial wrappings on the ground, with the head covering separate from the rest. The other disciple came in and they believed what they saw, although until then they had not understood the Scripture's message of Jesus' resurrection.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

"Peter proceeded to speak and said; 'You know what has happened all over Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached, how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power. He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him. We are witnesses of all that He did... they put Him to death hanging Him on a tree. This man God raised up on the third day and granted that He be visible not to all but to us, the witnesses chosen by God in advance who ate and drank with after He rose from the dead.'"

We can listen to many Easter sermons, telling of the events and appearances of Jesus. We visit the upper room with the apostles, meet Him with Mary in the garden, breakfast with Him on the shore of Tiberias, and share an evening meal in Emmaus. All are witness stories.

The Pentecost sermon of Peter summarizes the event of Easter and its meaning for the witnesses. He was anointed with the Holy Spirit so we too have been confirmed. He was filled with power, so too we who live the life of grace. He went about doing good, the work of the church and we missionary disciples today. We too are the chosen witnesses of the Risen One who eat at His table, breaking the bread of life.

Easter faith tells us that He lives and is among us. Easter joy fills us with a special enthusiasm. Easter commissioning sends us to bring that joy to others.

Cougar Non-Contact Passing League and Lineman Clinic
The Cougar Passing League and Lineman Clinic is designed to teach the fundamentals of football for players of all experience levels. Players will work skill development at the skill positions – Quarterback, Running back, Receiver, Tight End, Linebacker and Defensive back –and for the Offensive/Defensive Lineman. The sessions are designed to teach each player position-specific techniques working 1-on-1 and in small groups, and to apply those skills in a fun, round robin 7-on-7 (two-hand touch) competition at every session. Players also will be introduced to and learn spread offense concepts and defensive coverages, along with passing, catching, route running, blocking, snapping, pass-rush, and defensive back cover techniques in an environment focused on sportsmanship and teamwork. ♦The Passing League and Lineman Clinic is open to Students entering 6-8th grade in Corpus Christi, SMG, MMR, St. Stans, and St. Rose Parishes. ♦It will consist of 6 sessions meeting once a week, tentatively scheduled to begin in late April or May through mid-June at Corpus Christi Football field. ♦The sessions are Non-Contact, no pads are necessary. ♦The sessions will be approximately 90 minutes. ♦Corpus Christi will supply a football helmet to each player. ♦A mouthpiece is recommended. ♦What to bring for each session: Spikes/Sneakers, water and a great attitude! BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311*. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), at **7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e. April 16th, May 21st**.

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.** Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

***CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married, marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.*

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY**.
