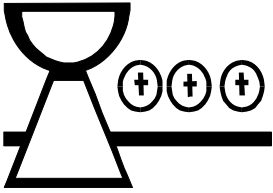

PASTOR'S MESSAGE



Dear Parishioners,

“Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive men’s sins, they are forgiven; if you hold them bound, they are held bound.” Everyone recognizes these words of our Lord as conferring on the Apostles and their successors the power to forgive sins and to restore one to the state of grace, the ticket to entry into heaven. With good reason this power is called the “Power of the Keys,” which is exercised through the Sacrament of Reconciliation or “Confession.”

Yet, we all know that something has happened to that sacrament in today’s Church. It seems to have fallen off into disuse. Gone are the weekly long lines at the confessional. Gone is the custom for many to avail themselves of frequent confession. What happened?

For one thing, we seem to have lost our consciousness of sin, or even belief in it. The “Sexual Revolution” has invaded every corner of modern life. The modern thinking, sadly, is “It can’t be all wrong. Everybody’s doing it. So what?”

Then, there is the mistaken notion about conscience. To some, conscience is a kind of language device inside us that says, “If it feels good, do it.” Actually, conscience is an act of judgment, of common sense, that judges whether an action is right or wrong. Like any judgment, it must be based on information, especially information about what God expects of us. That information is available in the teaching of the Church. It’s not a question of following either conscience or the Church. It’s a matter of following an “Informed” conscience, one that pays heed to the teaching of the Church.

Then, there are some theologians who have sown confusion among us by their questioning of almost any pronouncement of the Church, claiming that only what is solemnly defined need be observed. Thankfully, Pope John Paul II settled that issue with his decree: On Safeguarding the Faith. Other theologians have muddied the water by introducing misleading concepts into Moral Theology, the study of what is right and wrong. Terms like “pre-moral evil,” “fundamental options,” “serious sin,” and so on. Fortunately, Pope John Paul II pointed out the flaw in such ideas in some of his Apostolic Letters but, unfortunately, they are not being read by enough of religious educators as avidly as popular theologians are read.

Certainly, the scandals on the part of a very small percentage of our priests have not helped either. The news media have blown these all out of proportion so as to caricature all priests as sexual predators. This is far from true!

Confusion and hesitation exists on the part of some concerning the three formats for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, particularly that of “general absolution”. Some have mistakenly construed it as doing away with the necessity for confession of individual sins. And the Penitential Rite of the Mass does not take the place of the Sacrament of Reconciliation; rather it should raise our consciousness for the need of the Sacrament of Forgiveness.

We need to make forgiveness and reconciliation a significant part of our lives, not only between Almighty God and ourselves, but also between ourselves and our neighbors.

Second Reading: I John 5:1-6 John explains that we become God's children by believing in Jesus. When we love God and concern ourselves only with pleasing God, our faith is strong enough to conquer the evil in our world.



Gospel: John 20:19-31 Jesus appeared to the disciples despite locked doors, breathed on them so that they could receive the Holy Spirit, and gave them the power to forgive sins in His name. Thomas, who was not present, refused to believe without seeing Jesus for himself. Jesus appeared again when Thomas was present, and told him, "Blest are they who have not seen and have believed."

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

"In this way we know that we love the children of God when we love God and obey His commandments. For the love of God is this, that we keep His commandments. And His commandments are not burdensome, for whoever is begotten by God conquers the world. And the victory that conquers the world is our faith...Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, 'Peace be with you.'"

One day a sign outside a church read 'God gave us commandments, they are not suggestions.' As we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday, we are well aware of the Lord's desire to give us His peace, to offer us His mercy. There are two requirements for this to happen, 1.) We ask for His gift of peace and pardon and 2.) We acknowledge our dependence upon the Lord to be so blessed.

The ten commandments of Exodus were the requirement of the covenant. The great commandment of Jesus, love of God and neighbor allows me to focus more clearly on what I need to do. In both cases I must act. The question 'how well am I doing?' is answered when I look at the beatitudes of Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount to discover that I am poor in spirit, meek, humble, working for justice, being a peace builder. Yes, love the children of God and keep His commandments

Through the Sacrament of Holy Orders, the deacon is configured to Christ the Servant. It is Christ the Servant who acts through the ministry of the deacon.

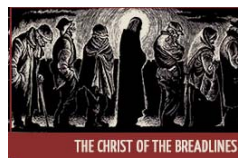

Cougar Non-Contact Passing League and Lineman Clinic
The Cougar Passing League and Lineman Clinic is designed to teach the fundamentals of football for players of all experience levels. Players will work skill development at the skill positions – Quarterback, Running back, Receiver, Tight End, Linebacker and Defensive back –and for the Offensive/Defensive Lineman. The sessions are designed to teach each player position-specific techniques working 1-on-1 and in small groups, and to apply those skills in a fun, round robin 7-on-7 (two-hand touch) competition at every session. Players also will be introduced to and learn spread offense concepts and defensive coverages, along with passing, catching, route running, blocking, snapping, pass-rush, and defensive back cover techniques in an environment focused on sportsmanship and teamwork. ♦The Passing League and Lineman Clinic is open to Students entering 6-8th grade in Corpus Christi, SMG, MMR, St. Stans, and St. Rose Parishes. ♦It will consist of 6 sessions meeting once a week, tentatively scheduled to begin in late April or May through mid-June at Corpus Christi Football field. ♦The sessions are Non-Contact, no pads are necessary. ♦The sessions will be approximately 90 minutes. ♦Corpus Christi will supply a football helmet to each player. ♦A mouthpiece is recommended. ♦What to bring for each session: Spikes/Sneakers, water and a great attitude! BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, **parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.**

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. April 16th, May 21st.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered, practicing member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.**

Certificates of eligibility* must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

****CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months

Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.**

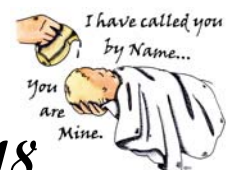
