#### Dear Parishioners,

Do you love Me?

In our first reading today, we get a glimpse of the urgency that Peter ascribed to the mission he had received. The disciples are hauled before the Sanhedrin and ordered not to speak about the name of Jesus. Yet, they essentially refuse on the basis that they must obey God and not man. Even suffering for the sake of proclaiming the name of Jesus as the only Savior was something to rejoice about.

of the saints and see the risks and sufferings which they endured for the sake of the gospel. What an example we had in the pastoral ministry of Pope John Paul II. Would anyone question how seriously he took his responsibilities as successor to Peter?

In the gospel today, we hear of the third appearance of Jesus to the apostles. Jesus focuses attention specifically on Peter and asks him three times, "Do you love Me?" Three times - one for each of his denials on the night that Jesus was betrayed. We have seen that Peter first had to be reconciled and healed of his denial of Jesus before he could move forward to carry out his mission.

Each of us is in need of reconciliation and healing as we go through life. Easter is a time to return to or deepen our experience of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We do this not out of fear because of judgment, but because Jesus wants to heal and restore us for the mission that lies ahead.

As we celebrate the Eucharist we need to pray that the Holy Spirit will stir in each one of us, a new awareness of our own need for healing and forgiveness. We need to pray that as community we will be prompted by that same Holy Spirit to a new urgency to spread the gospel in the darkness of the modern world.

**First Reading:** *Acts 5:27-32, 40b-41* The high priest chastised Peter and the other apostles for continuing to preach when they had been ordered to stop. Peter replied he would rather obey God than men, considering God's power even over death. They are again warned to stop speaking of Jesus, and then freed.

**Responsorial Psalm:** *30:2,4,5-6,11-12,13* A song of praise to God who rescues us.

**Second Reading:** *Revelation 5:11-14* John had a vision of many angels and all the living creatures of the world gathered around a throne. The angels cried out that the slain Lamb was worthy of receiving power, glory and praise. Then every creature on earth called out praise to God and the Lamb, and the elders fell down and worshipped.



**Gospel:** John 21:1-19 Jesus appeared to the disciples for the third time since His resurrection while they were fishing. They hadn't caught anything, and then Jesus advised them to cast their net from the other side of the boat. When they did this, they caught a great number of fish. Jesus then asked Peter three times, "Do you love Me?" When Peter said he did, Jesus asked him to tend and feed His sheep.

#### **Family Connection**

Today's Gospel describes what we can easily imagine as a picnic on the beach. Just as Jesus' miracle at the wedding feast at Cana blesses the love between man and woman celebrated in the sacrament of marriage, Jesus' attentiveness to food and mealtimes raises the possibility that our meal gatherings can be sacred times. In families, the domestic church, our meals together are everyday opportunities to gather and recall Jesus' presence with us. As in the Eucharist, we bring the gifts that God has given us, which have been prepared especially for our Mass, and at our family meals we share gifts that God has given to us and that we have worked together to prepare. This includes the food on the table and also the people who gather around the table. We ask God to bless these gifts and to be present among us in all of our interactions.

Consider a recent family meal: What food was served? Where did the food come from? Who prepared the food? Who served the food? Was mealtime a happy time? Why or why not? Observe that today's Gospel tells about a meal that Jesus shared with his disciples after his Resurrection. Read aloud today's Gospel, John 21:1-14. Reflect on the Gospel reading using the questions above. Talk about ways in which this meal that Jesus shared with his disciples might remind us of the meal we share at the Eucharist. You might choose to plan a special meal together as a family, encouraging each person to participate in the meal preparation. BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.

Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month i.e. April 15th, May 20th.

#### **REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS**

- must be a registered, practicing member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized Confirmed and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent MUST be Catholic
- $\rightarrow$ a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

### Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility\* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.

Certificates of eligibility\* must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

\*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY: A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. This person must be registered and an active *member of the parish for at least six* (6) *months.* Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY**.


