





PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

The gospel today finds Jesus boldly proclaiming, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life: no one comes to the Father except through Me." Jesus is telling us that through Him is the only way to come to God the Father. The life of Christ is not simply an historic life of a good man who lived life by intelligent, social principles. No, the life of Christ is a timeless guide – a map to God for people of all ages.



If Christ is to be our guide, and the only means to get to heaven, we have to have the same basic assumptions as when using a map. First of all, we have to believe that the life of Christ will show us the way. We must believe that the way in which Christ lived and His teachings are the directions by which to live our life's journey. We must believe that it is the way to our Father's house in heaven.

Secondly, we must believe that Christ is truth. The principles and values which He set forth for us are timeless truths of life. The example He gave to us of selfless giving and sacrifice is a timeless model of life. The words which He spoke reveal to us the commands of God. Unless we believe that Jesus is telling us the truth, how could we ever expect to get to our destination of heaven?

Thirdly, we must believe that Christ will lead us to life. We must trust that the path on which Christ leads us is not some joy ride, nor is it a path to destruction or an irrelevant journey. This is so important because following in the footsteps of Christ may take us through some pretty rough places: rejection, betrayal, misunderstanding, abandonment, suffering, and even death. It is then that Christ gently tells us, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Have faith in God and faith in Me." Beyond all of our struggles is the glory of resurrection and life with God forever. Yes, it is the path to eternal life in heaven. It is on this destination that our eyes must be focused.

In the early days of the Church, imitating the life of Christ was called living the Christian way. For us today, it is still our way; it is our means to life. We have been given Christ as our map to heaven, but we must be willing to live the life of Christ in order to stay on the right path.

Many times in life we become rather typical. We think that we know a shortcut to heaven. We get distracted by other roads which go in other directions. We fail to take the life of Christ with us and to follow it. There are times that we let other people convince us that there are other ways to go. Yet, time and again, these ways lead to dead ends, frustration, pain, and worst of all, a chance that we may never arrive at our prepared place in heaven.

We belong to Christ. He wants us to be with Him forever. He does not let us wander aimlessly. Rather, He shows us the way by becoming the way Himself. "I am the way, the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father except through Me." To be in heaven with God should be the life goal of every Christian. May God guide us as we continue on our life journey.







First Reading: Acts 6:1-7 During the early growth of the Church, the apostles realized that they needed more disciples in order to carry out effectively the ministry of the Church. The community selected seven men, one of whom was Stephen.

Responsorial 33:1-2, 4-5, 18-19 Lord, let Your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in You.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:4-9 Citing many uses of the word "stone" in the sayings of Jesus and in the Old Testament, Peter urges the Christians to be "living stones...an edifice of spirit."

Gospel: John 14:1-12 In this beautiful passage from the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, Jesus promises that He is preparing a place for the apostles. He tells them, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father but through Me." When Philip asks Jesus to show them the Father, Jesus answers, "Whoever has seen Me has seen the Father."



Therefore brethren pick out from among you seven men of good repute full of the Spirit and of wisdom

"It is not right for us to neglect the word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and the ministry of the word'... They presented these men to the apostles who prayed and laid hands on them. The word of God continued to spread,"... "I am the way and the truth and the life."

Times were tough then as they are now. Challenged by the needs of the people, those whom we now call deacons were summoned to preach the gospel in word and deed. St. Benedict taught his monks in the Rule, that when one was called from prayer to serve the material needs of others, it was part of ongoing prayer.

Deacons today serve well as preachers, ministers at liturgy, ministers for some sacraments and ministers of charity. They, through their witness and example, lead others to Jesus, the Way, a route to be taken, the Truth, providing His teaching, and the Life, the grace which flow from the sacraments. In a single word, deacons are ministers of service.

All disciples of the Lord are called to diaconal ministry as we serve, not in ordained ministry, but through word we witness and both anticipate and respond to the needs of others. Consider those who provide for the corporal works of mercy and discover the Acts of the Apostles being lived out today.



Reflection From Pope Francis

Vatican City, May 12, 2014 / 09:23 am (CNA/EWTN News).- In his daily homily Pope Francis recalled the conversion of the first pagans to Christianity, explaining that the Holy Spirit brings us beyond our natural limits, and we should not block Him with our own plans.

"To use a word of St. John XXIII: it is the Holy Spirit that updates the Church: Really, He really updates it and keeps it going," the Pope observed in his May 12 daily Mass. The pontiff recounted the day's first reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, in which Peter baptizes a group of pagans and is criticized by the Christian community for doing so because they were "unclean."

However, when Peter described the vision he had telling him to go to the pagans and how he saw the Holy Spirit descend on them as it did with the Apostles on Pentecost, the Christian community then rejoices that the Gentiles were saved, the Pope continued.

The Roman Pontiff then noted that the Holy Spirit goes where It wills, and that one of the greatest temptations of believers is to block Its action by trying to force It go in one direction or the other. Read more at <http://www.catholicnewsagency.com>

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend **Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation** before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, *parents are required to pre-register those attending the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311.* Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), **at 7:00 PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e. May 19th or June 16th.**

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and receive a Certificate of Eligibility* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized - Confirmed - and has received First Holy Communion - and actively practicing their faith - e.g., attending Mass, receiving Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of Penance
- if married - must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism — if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness - the other godparent **MUST** be Catholic
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: **The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date.** Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

***CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY:** *A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed and married in the Catholic Church and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this person should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.* Baptism is administered at **12:30 PM EVERY SUNDAY.**
