PASTOR'S CORNER

As you've read in Flocknote, we've extended the window to respond to the Disciple Maker Index to April 13, Easter Monday. So just like the Census Bureau is bombarding you with ads to fill out that census form, I'm doing the same. We want to know about your spiritual life and your life of discipleship. And just like that Census, it's confidential. I don't see names; just your responses. https://www.catholicleaders.org/disciple-maker-index

And something that would make for a long Flocknote but I can delve into here; and I'll be referring to this in Flocknote too...

With Covid-19 keeping us from celebrating Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum together, what are some decent alternatives? As I've said in Flocknote, if you want to watch these liturgies, go to the Archdiocesan website for live streaming from the Cathedral. I wish we had it here but we're getting there. For now, I think the Cathedral is your best bet; no offense to any of our neighbors who have live streaming right now—I'm just jealous.

Another option that's available to you is one that also lets you take a more active role in prayer. That's the Liturgy of the Hours (LOH). AKA "the Divine Office" or "the Breviary," this is an official prayer of the Church that doesn't require you to be IN a church. Clergy and many religious orders are required to parts or all of the LOH and for myself, I can say it certainly adds to my spirituality. And there are special prayers for Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum that might be beneficial to you as well, especially since we can't engage in many of our traditional prayers and devotions this year.

Best way to access the LOH—two different apps—iBreviary and Laudate. Both have Apple and Android versions (and both are FREE!). I personally prefer iBreviary—it's a bit more the official version of the LOH and you can download days ahead for when you might not have an internet connection—but Laudate will work for these purposes as well. And there are some others out there but I know these two are free and you know the old saying "If it's free, it's for me!"

Each app has other prayers too. I don't know Laudate as well, but iBreviary has all the texts for the Masses of Holy Week and the readings if you're interested and I think Laudate does too. But the important thing about using the LOH prayers is that you're less a passive observer of live streamed prayer but totally a participant. Yes, we do our best in these crazy times and if you participated in the Holy Hour live streamed from Rome on March 27th, it was a great thing. But the LOH, as I've said, is an official prayer that doesn't need you to be in a Church building. I often prayed mine on the elliptical or stationary bike at the gym (when it was OPEN!)—healthy body; healthy soul and vice versa!

And when folks ask me about deepening their prayer life, I'll often suggest the LOH. So consider it for this year's Holy Week and who knows? Might open up another great prayer experience for you too.

First Reading: *Isaiah* 50:4-7 In a tone of quiet sadness, Isaiah describes the buffets and insults given to the Suffering Servant. The passage ends on a note of hope.

Responsorial: PS 22:8-9, 17-18, 19-20, 23-24 R. (2a) My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

Second Reading: *Philippians 2:6-11* In exultant tones, Paul tells the Philippians to rejoice because Christ became man, died on the cross, rose from the dead, and sits triumphantly at the right hand of the Father.

Gospel: Matthew 26:14—27:66 This is the solemn narrative of the passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. Matthew recounts the treachery and betrayal of Judas and then describes the events of the Last Supper, culminating in the institution of the Eucharist. Jesus endures the Agony in the Garden; He is then brought before Caiaphas and Pilate and condemned to death. After His resurrection, the centurions shouted, "Clearly this was the Son of God!"



HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William J. Reilly

The Lord God has given me a well trained tongue, that I may know how to speak to the weary a word that will rouse them.. The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced. I have set my face like flint, knowing that I shall not be put to shame.

May the Word of God stir us to begin this Holy Week with a deep desire to grow closer to the Lord. The events we recall are not to be seen as a story of how great was Jesus' love for us then, but to seek and find Him and discover His unending love for us today.

The saving work of Jesus is taking place right now. As I begin this week, I look for His saving grace in my life, my home, our world. We enter into this saving work as He entered the holy city. We unite ourselves to Him, as we sit at the last supper, weep in Gethsemane, walk to Calvary, and await the good news of the resurrection.

Holy Week does not just happen; it calls me to live the drama of the paschal mystery with Him.

BAPTISM INSTRUCTION SESSIONS: Parents and Godparents must attend Pre-Jordan Sacramental Preparation before the Baptism takes place. Prior to attendance, parents are required to pre-register those attendance the session by contacting the Parish Center Office, 215-855-1311. Although instruction sessions are mandatory for both Parents and Godparents, you are required to attend one time only. If you have attended previously you are not required to come again. Ideally, attendance at the preparation session should occur before the child's birth. Upcoming sessions are scheduled in the RE Room (in the church), at 7,000 and the 3rd Monday of the month is a Mary 18th. 7:00PM on the 3rd Monday of the month: i.e. May 18th (pending).

REQUIREMENTS FOR GODPARENTS

- must be a registered member of a Catholic Parish and \rightarrow receive a Certificate of Eligibility* from that Parish and have attended the Pre-Jordan Baptism class
- must have completed his/her 16th birthday
- must have been Baptized Confirmed and has received First Holy Communion and actively practicing their faith e.g., attending Mass, receiving \rightarrow Holy Communion - receiving the Sacrament of
- if married must be living in a valid sacramental marriage
- cannot be the parent of the child to be baptized
- \rightarrow the godparents are to be one male and one female
- one godparent may be a non-Catholic Christian witness with proper proof of his/her baptism if a non-Catholic is asked to be a Christian witness, the other godparent MUST be Catholic \rightarrow
- a person who has left the Catholic Faith for any reason, may not be asked to carry out this responsibility

Please note: The paperwork for the child's baptism and certificates of eligibility* MUST be completed at least two weeks prior to scheduling a baptism date. Certificates of eligibility must have a parish seal and cannot be faxed; they must be the original.

*CERTIFICATES OF ELIGIBILITY: A certificate of eligibility is asking for a priest to sign and acknowledge that the person is 16 years of age or more, confirmed (and if married, marriage took place in the Catholic Church) and celebrating the sacraments regularly. Ideally, this projection should be registered and an active member of the parish for at least six (6) months.

Baptism is administered at 12:30PM almost EVERY SUNDAY.

DAILY PRAYER - CHURCH OPEN 9AM-5PM: Those who wish to make a visit to the Blessed Sacrament during the day may do so in the Main Church. The Church is open every day until 3:30PM except Wednesday when it is open until 6:30PM.

REGISTRATION: Our diocese requires that all Catholics should be registered in the parish of their residence. If you have moved into our parish and have not registered with us, it is important that you call the Parish Center Office (215-855-1311) and make arrangements to do so as soon as possible. Certificates of Eligibility to act as a sponsor for Baptism or Certification and the second specific and the secon Confirmation, cannot be issued unless you are already (preferably for 6 months) registered with us. Please be aware that young adults over 21 (25 if in college) should register separately.
